


Hold down the CTRL key and the letter 'F' at the same time. A search box appears in the upper right hand corner. Type a word(s) in the box to search the document for the word(s).

The complicating factor is the Walter Schoen drain handles the surface water and the sub-surface water drains to the Charles Schoen Drain.

The Petitioners believe that the benefit to those owners benefited is likely to be greater than the damage which may be suffered by those owners by said part of ditch being reconstructed.

Therefore the undersigned petitioners pray that this Board refer said Ditch to the Surveyor for a Reconstruction and Maintenance report, that assessments be made fairly and equitable against the affected owners in order that said ditch may be restored as effective; and for all proper relief in the premises.

We the undersigned freeholders of Montgomery County, Indiana, being the petitioners in the above entitled proceeding herewith, undertake to stand as sureties to the County of Montgomery, Indiana to pay the cost of notice, engineering fees, and all legal costs in case the drainage proposed in the petition herein is not established. Landowners were concerned with some erosion near the county road and who would be responsible for this.

Proposed yearly assessment:\$1400.00. Current balance: \$863.00 Surveyor, Harvey Keller, reported the following:

a. This drain is in very poor condition.

b. There are several tile holes (approx 8) on Klepfers property.

c. Tile outlet area and the outlet pipe is destroyed (Rush property) due to cattle being allowed to wander in this area. The tile in this pasture is very shallow and has several tile holes. Approximately 600 feet of tile need to be replaced.

d. On Rush property brush is out of control. (in the pasture mentioned in item c.

Surveyors recommendations were as follows:

The Montgomery County Drainage Board met Monday, March 12, 1990, 2:00 P.M., Commissioners Room, Courthouse, Crawfordsville, Indiana.

Those present were as follows: Chairman, James Kirtley; Vice-Chairman, Sam Kessler; Member, Bob Thayer; Deputy Auditor, Janet Harris, Surveyor, Harvey Keller; Highway Superintendent, Gordon (Bud) Holloway; Contractor, Jack Jones and Fountain County Highway Superintendent, Walt Wilson.

Chairman, James Kirtley, called the meeting to order.

Surveyor, Harvey Keller, reported problems on the <u>Boswell Clough Drain</u>, located in the New Richmond area. Drain was reconstructed 1938. Items discussed were as follows:

a) The soil had eroded around a 20" metal CMP pipe and said pipe was ready to fall into the ditch. The pipe was removed and 60 feet of tile replaced. The tileout direction was rerouted and moved further upstream. Now 60 feet of tile goes to a right angle to Coal Creek.

b) Checked the catch basin. Water here was bubbling up due to heavy rain fall over the week-end.

c) The outlet is made up of two 15" tiles and a 10 " private line joining into one 15" tile.

Surveyor recommended the following:

a) Landowners petition to reconstruct.

b) Replace and redo the last 1/2 mile of this drain.

This drain is approximately 13,000 feet in length. Formula shows a 24 inch tile should be used. The Vice-Chairman, Sam Kessler recommended using plastic tile. The fund account shows a balance of 0.

Harvey offered to meet with landowners and further discuss this drain and its problems. Harvey specifically wanted it noted that he strongly advises doing something about this Clough Drain.

Member, Bob Thayer, stated he was going to attend New Richmond Town Board meeting tonight and they would be discussing this drain. At this meeting he will suggest a petition needs to be carried.

Phillip Dewey Drain

Jim Clark, Manager of Halderman Farms, is carrying a petition to extend and reconstruct the northern portion of this ditch.

Mike Spencer, Surveyor of Tippecanoe County, Harvey and Stuart Kellerman, meet on the Dewey Ditch to discuss future plans. Depending on the length they set for a legal drain. This drain could possibly be a joint drain with Tippecanoe County.

Mike Spencer sent a map to Harvey which was reviewed by the Board at this meeting.

Any extension of this drain would immediately effect the following drains - Henry K. Lee - John Gobin - Sarah Kincaid - Thomas Wilkens and 2 open channels un-named.

Mike Spencer has 9 drains included in this watershed, but they are assessed on an individual basis. Landowners are expressing agreement to proceed a mile into Tippecanoe County. Drain could be known as the Dewey-Lough Drain. James Hose Drain.

a) a lot of water is standing.
b) There is heavy brush at the drain outlet at the railroad track.
c) Harvey suggested increasing maintenance assessments.
d) Harvey ask the Board to obtain a loan so some work could

d) Harvey ask the Board to obtain a loan so some work could be done.

Sam Kessler stated that a loan would be obtained after all hearings were held and the contractor bid was awarded.

Harvey reported that at present 14 drains are in the process of being repaired under maintenance.

Timothy Lane Drain

Harvey has meet with Conrail Railroad reps at the ditch site.

There is 125 feet of broken tile on Tributary # 1 (it is a part of the legal drain). And the following was discussed:

a) Will leave the old Interurban bridge standing.

b) Where the tile outlets now - cut an open ditch, bypassing the Interurban structure and running to the main ditch. This would be going then in a southerwesterly direction.

c) General location is adjacent to Buzz Feltner property.

John Gobin #2 Drain

The boring company suggested moving the tile 800 feet south of the present location. (This was not a feasible idea).

Harvey and his staff probed 900 feet of tile on the southeast side of Highway 231. They were trying to find he lowest point to install a breather.

It was discovered that the tile runs uphill. The soil cover is anywhere from 8 inches to 4 feet. The tile is not running full of water. Harvey recommended installing a breather.

Jack Jones is doing some repairs on the <u>Joel Tobin</u> Drain, located 350 South and Ladoga Road. Jack is going to clear 1300 feet of brush. The work will be done up to the railroad track. This will relieve pressure on the tile at the headwall. As soon as weather permits the dipping out will start.

William Epperson drain

Harvey has shot levels on this drain in preparation for cutting a new channel north and east to the railroad on the east side of 400.

Harvey reported he and his staff had attended Road School at Purdue University.

Most equipment was very high tech. Section corners are being found by satellite and computer systems.

Harvey ask for the Boards support when he goes before the County Council to request additional appropriations for a Theolidite and E.D.M. laser.

With this equipment not only would work time be cut ;by 50% but measurements would be most accurate. He went on to state he plans to set permanent monuments measuring 4 inches in diameter and 36 inches deep.

He plans to hire 2 summer employees for monumenting section stones.

The Board discussed a letter Harvey had received from Mr. Melvin Howell. Mr. Howell lives on Old 55 and Interstate 74. Sam Kessler recommended Harvey write a letter and include a map of Mr. Howells property and further explain the water problem.

explain the water problem. There being no further business, Chairman, James Kirtley, recessed the meeting. Time 3:00 P.M.

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MONTGOMERY COUNTY DRAINAGE BOARD March 26, 1990 1:40 P.M.

The Montgomey County Drainage Board met Monday, March 26, 1990, 1:40 P.M., Commissioners Office, Courthouse, Crawfordsville, Indiana.

Those present were as follows: Chairman, James Kirtley; Vice-Chairman, Sam Kessler; Member, Bob Thayer; Attorney, Don Schmidt and the following landowners; Bob Hodgen, Marion Kiger, Hugh Schoen, Darrell Hodgen, Steve Emmert and Eugene Johnson.

1:40 P.M. Chairman, James Kirtley, called the meeting to order.

The <u>Walter Schoen Ditch</u> was discussed. This drain is classified reconstruction. Landowners have paid (by mutual agreement) to have part of this drain dredged (work is completed) The work done included dredging - clearing of brush and repairs were made on the headwall. Landowners have expressed they want this drain (Walter Schoen) placed on maintenance assessment, not the open drain but the tile portion.

Bob Hodgen presented photos to the Board showing water crossing county roads at 700 East and 850 North (called Reid Paddock corner). Steve Emmert stated that water was also crossing the road on 800 East (approx 1/4 mile) south of the intersection of 750 East and 800 East. Water at Paddock corner is surface water from the Walter Schoen Drain. Mr. Hodgen stated the culverts are not large enough to carry the water. Mr. Hodgen feels that the culverts are restricting 2 feet of water flow.Water in Potato Creek was 2 feet lower than the water on the road.

Mr. Hodgen went on to discuss relocating a legal tile drain. He was advised that this action needs to be filed with the Surveyors Office and landowners also need to be notified of such action.

Mr. Hodgen ask if a natural waterway is a legal drain? Case being on <u>Charles Schoen Drain #2</u>. A waterway runs on top of a tile line. Attorney, Don Schmidt stated the tile is a part of the legal drain but the waterway is not. Waterways are under the jurisdiction of the Soil and Water Conservation Service.

As in any drain the watershed map and the ditch petitions need to be carefully studied to see what makes up the legal drain. Sometimes tributaries are included and sometimes not. Depending on what is stated in the petition and surveyors report.

Mr. Bob Hodgen carried a petition to add a 3rd tributary to the Charles Schoen #2 Drain. See drainage minutes of November 2, 1981 (copy attached). In the minutes it is discussing the same problem he had this year. No changes were made on the ditch map. On the map it is still called a private tile. The Board will discuss this with County Surveyor, Harvey Keller, before making a recommendation. Mr. Eugene Johnson discussed the <u>John McLaughlin Drain</u>. He ask if this drain could be placed on maintenance assessment? Without calling a meeting (involving Tippecanoe and Clinton Counties this Board can only make decisions & recommendations for property located in Montgomery County. The Board stated a petition needs to be carried. This petition could specify maintenance for Montgomery County. Mr. Johnson stated he will not carry a petition. He also went on to discuss that much work has been done on this drain. There being no further business, Chairman, James Kirtley, recessed the meeting. Time 3:00 P.M.

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MONTGOMERY COUNTY DRAINAGE BOARD April 2, 1990, 1:30 P.M.

The Montgomery County Drainage Board met Monday, April 2, 1990, 1:30 P.M., Commissioners Office, Courthouse, Crawfordsville, Indiana.

Those attending were as follows: Vice-Chairman, Sam Kessler; Member, Bob Thayer; Attorney, Don Schmidt; Surveyor, Harvey Keller; and the following property Horace Tomey, Lucile Gilstrap and Steven J. Voliva. owners:

Vice-Chairman, Sam Kessler, called the meeting to order.

Mr. Tomey was here to discuss water problems re: Shelley Drain. He presented a diagram and photos of the area of his residence and the newly constructed condominiums (named Montgomery Place). General location is southeasterly from the intersection of Highway 32 East and 47 North. The diagram presented showed streets, location of houses, the original location of Shelley Drain and the new location of the drains installed on Montgomery Place property. Since the construction of Montgomery Place the water

flowing onto Tomeys property has greatly increased.

Items reported were as follows: Contractors have moved the original outed same. This was done without Shelley Drain a) and the consent of the rerouted same. drainage board.

Contractors reported that they had cleaned out an 8 in b) tile line of the Shelley Drain, when it fact the main line is a 15 inch tile.

c) Reported they would build an earth dam. They have made no attempt to do this.

d) Filled the building area with 3 to 5 feet of soil.

e) In this area there are 3 - 24 inch pipes & tied into one 36 inch pipe. 1 - 12 tile

June 5, 1989 Tom Dawson of Montgomery Savings and Monty f) Harris, Attorney ask that the Board reduce the legal drain

right-of-way from 75 feet (either side of tile total 150 feet) to 25 feet with option to build within 10 feet of the

right-of-way. Board denied this request. (Book 4 pages 122 & 126).

g) Montgomery Savings ask permission from the State Highway Department to run an open drain along Highway 32 right-of-way. This request was denied.

h) Shelley Drain tile runs 1/2 full of water even in very dry weather.

Shelley Drain - drains a very large portion of the East side of the city, some of the areas involved are: John Beard School, Cloverdale Apartments, Meadow Wood Apartments, B & D Lumber, Eastern Acres, Countryside Plaza, Raymark, Green Acres Sub-division.

Water problems in Eastern Acres (which is part of the Shelley Drain) have been discussed before. Landowners voted against reconstruction of this drain.

County Surveyor, Harvey Keller, reported he had approached the City about maintaining this drain. The city refused.

Attorney, Don Schmidt, ask how this drain was classified? It is classified reconstruction but it is also a legal drain, located in the city limits.

Mr. Tomey ask what he could do to get relief from the water problems. He has keep the waterway mowed and very well groomed for approximately 30 year.

County Attorney, suggested a temporary injunction. This would promptly get the owners (Montgomery Savings) attention.

The Board stated when a drain is classified reconstruction, (meaning assessments are not collected) there is not much that the Drainage Board can do. But the Board did ask that Mr. Tomey keep them informed as to how things work out.

Vice-Chairman, Sam Kessler, reported Ed Saylor ask what the County Surveyor was doing on Coreys property on Plank Road. Harvey reported he was checking & probing for drainage problems relating to Clearview Addition and Foster Fletcher Drain. There are 7 field tile in this area ranging in size 6 to 8 inches. He recorded 15 feet of fall in this area. Mr. Saylor had accused Surveyors Office of private work on company time. Not so.

Surveyor reported on the following drains: Joel Tobin and Timothy Lane. meet with the utility reps from the railroad and Sprint Company.

Joel Tobin Drain:

Jack Jones, contractor, has finished work, cleared brush & placed 56 tons of rip-rap. This fall the banks will be sprayed.

Timothy Lane Drain

The railroad had dumped old railroad ties on the railroad right-of-way, blocking water flow on a tributary to this drain. Said tributary is a part of the maintained drain.

Age & time have destroyed approximately 125 feet of tile. This will be replaced by 40 feet of 15 inch tile, bypassing the box structure and outletting into an open drain. Watkins Construction have done this work.

Charles Bronough reported an obstruction to the drain. Railroad would not grant permission to go on railroad property. Railroad brought in their own crew and equipment and cleaned out the problem area.

Ron Taylor has signed the contract to begin work on the Epperson Drain.

Harvey presented 2 petitions to the Board:

a) <u>Levi Hawkins</u> Drain - petition to reconstruct (drain is already on maintenance). 345 acres signed petition.

b) Phillip Dewey Drain - petition to extend and reconstruct.

Said extension is from 1100 North to Tippecanoe County line. Tippecanoe County landowners want this drain extended approximately 1 mile into Tippy County. Harvey reported that a joint drainage board would need to be formed. Montgomery County having the majority of acres.

Tippecanoe County Commissioner, Bruce Osborn, called the Surveyors Office, requesting an updated property owners list for John McLaughlin drainage area. Attorney, Don Schmidt, ask if there were any additional tiles that need to be included in McLaughlin Drain watershed?

Charles Schoen Drain #2

It has been concluded that tributary # 3 is a part of the legal maintained drain. It had not been recorded in the drainage records & meeting minutes as such.

Bob Thayer moved and Sam Kessler seconded a motion to place Charles Schoen # 2 Drain tributary #3 under maintenance assessment. The legal drain now consists of the main line and three tributaries. Motion unanimous. Debbie Priebe property in Ladoga was discussed. Harvey

restated that there are no legal drains in this area. Attorney, Don Schmidt, will correspond with Attorney, James Ayres, informing him of the same. Ms. Priebe is being represented by James Ayres.

Harvey Keller reported work on the following drains: James Hose Drain.

a) Water in main line is running swift but tile running at 1/2 capacity.

b) old town tile - water is moving very slow.

Surveyor recommended the following items:

a) clear 1 acre of heavy brush - north side of the railroad track.

b) cut trees in this same area.

clean out the tile (i.e. jet spraying) c)

d) spray tree stumps.

Summer plans are too hire 2 part time employees to monument section stones.

Harvey attended a Monsanto seminar at Indianapolis and he gave a short speech. Monsanto is going to use this county as a model county and they will select 2 drains for their spraying project. This will be done at no charge. There being no further business, Vice-Chairman, Sam Kessler, recessed the meeting. Time 3:00

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The Montgomery County Drainage Board met Monday, May 7, 1990, 1:30 p.m., Commissioners Crawfordsville, Indiana. Office, Courthouse,

Those attending were as follows: Chairman, James Kirtley; Vice-Chairman, Sam Kessler; Member, Bob Thayer; Second Deputy to the Surveyor, Nancy Jones; and following property owners; Horace Tomey, Lucile Gilstrap, the Durbin Mitchell, and Melvin Howell.

Chairman James Kirtley called the meeting to order. Melvin Howell, who lives off of Interstate Highway 74 and old state road 55, was there to discuss water problems with his duct work. He said he has water in the duct work and that his foundation is also damaged.

Sam Kessler told Mr. Howell we have been there before to check out his problem. Sam did not think it was a legal drain. Melvin stated that he pays on the Sanders Drain, so he wants to know why he pays on this drain if he is not going to benefit from it. Sam said if he is indeed on the Sanders Drain he should benefit from it. Melvin said a law suit is next if he can not work this problem out with us.

Durbin Mitchell next reported that he thinks his ditch is either Raymond Weliever or Glennard Miller, which is $\frac{1}{2}$ mile west of Interstate 74. He said he spoke to Larry Utz and Larry told him to be at this meeting today. Sam set up a meeting for Monday, May 14, at 1:30 p.m., for Mr. Howell and Mr. Mitchell.

Horace Tomey, who resides at #8 Eastgate Drive, Crawfordsville and Lucile Gilstrap were there to discuss the Shelly Drain. Mr. Tomey said that he and Lucile are on the Shelly Drain and are having lots of water problems ever since the Condominiums were built. The Montgomery Savings Association did not notify them about work around their area on the drain. He said five people were against the work, but no one would listen to them. He also said that Tammy Baretto said that no plat maps on drainage had to be filed. Shelly Drain is now plugged up behind the Condo's. Tomey further stated that he has talked to some of the landowners on Eastern Acres and the ones he talked to said they wouldn't on the Shelly Drain if they would mind being assessed benefit from it.

Sam told Mr. Tomey that we need to set up a meeting with lawyer Don Schmidt to see if an ordinance may be planned. Bob Thayer asked Mr. Tomey if Don Schmidt talked to him about a temporary injunction. Mr. Tomey said that Don Schmidt said he thought he could get one. He also said if he had to do that he would get a lawyer out of town and that he was not going to back off on this problem.

Sam then set up a meeting on Tuesday, May 29 at 1:30 p.m. with the Shelly landowners and Lawyer Don Schmidt. He stated that we need to check the statute on the legal part to see if anything can be done with this problem on the Shelly Drain. Mr. Tomey added that part of the problem involved the Cloverdale Heights Add. The meeting concluded at 3:30 p.m., there being

no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

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MONTGOMERY COUNTY DRAINAGE BOARD May 14, 1990

The Montgomery County Drainage Board met Monday, May 14, at 1:30 p.m. in Room 103 of the Courthouse Crawfordsville, Indiana.

Those attending were as follows: Chairman, James Kirtley; Vice-Chairman, Sam Kessler; Member, Bob Thayer; Surveyor, Harvey Keller; First Deputy, Larry Utz; and the following property owners: Melvin Howell and Durbin Mitchell.

Chairman, James Kirtley, called the meeting to order.

The <u>JAMES</u> <u>SANDERS</u> Drain was discussed first. Harvey showed a map to landowner, Melvin Howell, who discovered water in his area. Mr. Howell stated there is a hole in a tile. The damaged tile, however, is not part of the legal drain. The assessment pays only for the legal drain. A petition from landowners could make it a tributary, Harvey said. On the problem near the pond, Mr. Howell showed pictures of flooding. Mr. Howell stated he hired an attorney from Indianapolis concerning this matter, and he referred him to this board. According to the attorney, Mr. Howell said another 300 ft. on the ditch sould take care of the problem or putting in a larger tile. Landowner, Charles Graves has flooding also, Howell said. Harvey said maybe when I-74 was built a tile was cut. Howell said one of Charles Grave's tiles is cut and that repairing this tile would also drain Graves. Harvey said this could be handled privately, since it is not part of the legal drain.

Howell said he has damage to his duct-work and foundation of his home. Howell said the ditch should be dug deeper and a pipe put in a side ditch. The Sanders Drain has a petition that has passed to rework the open ditch to Road 500 W. The Sanders tile is in good shape with exeption of one area near I-74. (Water overflow from Howells area drains into the tile.) Mr. Kirtley asked if replacing the broken tile would solve the problem? Howell said yes, but further stated that landowner, Mr. Knowling, had plowed it over before. Sam Kessler stated that we aren't responsible for any tributaries unless they are marked part of the legal drain. Harvey said this is true. Mr. Howell said his attorney told him I-74 should have built an escape tile or ditch, but they did not. Harvey said the one who built I-74 are, therefore, responsible, and further stated that Mr. Lyon had us come out this winter. He had three private drains and I didn't work on any of these either.

Mr. Kirtley asked how then can Mr. Howell handle this? Mr. Howell answered that he would have to file a lawsuit. Harvey said his hands are tied because it is a private tile. Howell said, "I could damm it (the tile), and flood old state road 55." He then asked if we could put a tile on Charles Graves property, under the side ditch? He said this would solve everything and would be simple. Harvey said this is a County Highway Road. Sam Kessler then said we could put a sewer across the road, but not in the ground for privately owned properties. We have been asked by many property owners to do this--we can not.

Mr. Thayer asked if Harvey had dug out in this area before? Harvey said they flagged an area, dug, but never saw a tile. Russ Nelson looked for one along with Gordon Holloway. Mr. Howell said he saw a small one (6"), but it wasn't hooked into anything. Sam Kessler said that we can't legally solve this problem. Mr. Kirtley asked for a statement of what could be done. Sam Kessler said the state should put in a ditch from this to the James Sanders Drain because it isn't the county's responsibility. Harvey said that if Mr. Knowling is damaging private tile, that Mr. Howell could then take matters against him privately.

Harvey reported that the James Sanders Drain was built in 1903 and that it has never been reconstructed. There is a petition to extend it as an open drain--which would help Mr. Howell somewhat.

Mr. Kessler said for Mr. Howell to go back to his attorney. We cannot help him. Sam Kessler then asked Harvey to survey this whole area. Mr. Howell asked us to send him a letter of our findings. Harvey agreed. Harvey did say that the Sanders Ditch Fund cannot pay for this, however. Harvey told Mr. Howell he would get out there this week, but concerning the problem behind his house with the damaged tile, this is between he and Mr. Knowling. Mr. Thayer said we would get back with Mr. Howell.

Mr. Kirtley asked what other business was on the agenda. Property owner Durbin Mitchell was there to discuss the <u>RAYMOND WELLIEVER DRAIN</u>. Mr. Mitchell asked who came out and looked at it. Larry Utz said he did. Mr. Mitchell reported a tile hole and that water was washing his field and fence. Sam Kessler said that we could clean the side ditch, but can't interfere with the waterway. The Soil Conservation Service would have to do that. Mr. Mitchell said there was a waterway at one time, but that Pete Evans, a previous property owner, plowed it up. Harvey said he could talk to him (Evans) about it. Durbin Mitchell said he plowed up two waterways, in fact. Mrs. Mitchell showed Larry Utz photos of the area in question. Sam Kessler said even if we were to clean the ditch, that the next rain would wash it out again. Harvey and Larry discussed this. Larry Utz asked if Mr. & Mrs. Mitchell had talked to

Larry Utz asked if Mr. & Mrs. Mitchell had talked to Wayne McCutcheon? Mr. Mitchell said his son, David, had. Larry and Harvey agreed to contact Wayne McCutcheon, the Soil Conservation Service, and David Mitchell regarding this matter. Larry showed the photos to Harvey.

Harvey said that there is a breather that is part of the County Tile. If it is eroded, we could repair that. After looking at the photos, he reported that it is considerably worse than since they had been there last.

considerably worse than since they had been there last. James Kirtley asked what other business was next on the agenda.

Surveyor, Harvey Keller, requested that he and attorney Don Schmidt meet to draw up a new maintenance contract for drains, which would include estimates on backhoe & labor, hours worked, iteminzing materials, and having contractors call the Surveyors Office on days they are to work. Harvey said the existing contract is too vague, that contractors bills are becoming too expensive and that they are inconsistant on charges. Sam Kessler agreed with the need to do this.

Harvey said he would like to have a contract that would be fair to both parties. He said that while some contractors are fair, some are not. We have looked at some other county's contracts and may be able to adopt one that is workable for us.

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May 14, 1990 -conti-

Harvey then reported on drains that are up for Reconstruction. The <u>ALBERT HYSONG DRAIN</u> was first up for discussion. There is a problem about the money being collected on this drain. Some landowners have never paid on this drain. Sam Kessler said it is up to the county officials to collect it. We will investigate this matter further. The <u>LEVI HAWKINS</u> DRAIN, north of Waveland was discussed next. We have taken all the shots on tile of 1300 feet and new outlet 15 and 18 inch tile. We will continue to draw up plans. There is no status change on the WILLIAM J. <u>YELTON DRAIN</u>. All of the shots have been taken. We can work on the Yelton as soon as plans are finished on the HAWKINS DRAIN. Harvey said we haven't heard anything from Clinton County on the JOHN MCLAUGHLIN DRAIN.

County on the <u>JOHN MCLAUGHLIN DRAIN</u>. On the <u>JAMES HOSE DITCH</u> in Linden, we have a proposal in progress. We will start work on clearing trees and opening up the tile. At the outlet, water is backing up. At Robert Horneys house, on the upper end, Larry said the catch basin is full and backed up--that is the old town tile. Larry said it is over half full of dirt. It must be jetted out. Harvey said the assessment must be raised, there has been so much water and so much damage done. Larry Utz reported that some tree roots could be involved behind the tavern. We will keep an eye on it. Harvey said we would write to the Linden Town Board regarding this matter.

Harvey then reminded the board of presentation by ACCS. This presentation is about a new computer system for the Surveyors Office.

Ron Taylor has almost completed the reconstruction of the <u>WILLIAM EPPERSON DRAIN.</u> Harvey added that we did have to clean out 300 more feet on this drain. He showed photos of this problem. There is almost a waterfall about 200 feet above where they worked last year. Harvey made a change order form on this matter. Sam Kessler then asked Auditor Nelda Hester how much money was left for this drain. She did not know, but Kessler thought it was about \$5,000. He said that down by Dennis Strasburgers property, there is too steep a slope. Nucor flushes overflow water into this drain and the water rises almost one foot as a result.

and the water rises almost one foot as a result. There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 3:30 p.m.

Members of the Montgomery County Drainage Board, Auditor, Nelda Hester; members of the Montgomery County Council, Stoney McGaughey, and Surveyor, Harvey Keller met on Monday, May 21, 1990, at 1:30 p.m. to witness a demonstration from ACCS in Frankfort, Indiana, about a new computer system.

After completion of the demonstration, the members of the Montgomery County Council asked Mike Kirbey from ACCS, for an estimate of the cost of payments on leasing such system.

Surveyor, Harvey Keller, needs to present a letter to the Council asking them for permission to lease with an option to buy a computer system worth in excess of \$22,000.00 over a 3-5 year period. ACCS agreed to send Harvey the detailed figures on such a plan.

After the demonstration, the Montgomery County Drainage Board conducted some business. First discussed, was the JAMES HOSE DITCH. Harvey said they are starting work on the north side of the Railroad tracks. The tile there was at least three fourths full of water, the water coming out of the tile was just a matter of inches. There were two bids sent out concerning this problem. One to Watkins Construction and one to Cain Brothers, with Watkins Construction winning, with the lowest bid of \$2,380.00.

The approximate length of the tile is 330 ft. Harvey stated that they would be clearing trees and brush on the north and south side up to the Northfield Addition. He said they would open it in several spots and inspect it. He suspects some tiles were cut when the sewage system was put in, and said it would be necessary to open it to see.

Mrs. Parker from Linden has contacted the Surveyor and Commissioners about a problem on her property in Linden. There is a hole under her garage floor. It is caused from a tile hole in the Hose Drain. The home was built over the tile.

Sam Kessler asked Harvey to get a bid on how much it would take to fix this problem. He stated, however, that a landowner cannot build on or over a tile and that the County cannot be liable if the garage does cave in.

Bob Thayer suggested that Harvey go around the garage with the new tile. Sam Kessler said to fill the old tile with gravel and reroute the new tile around the garage. Bob Thayer asked Harvey to call Mrs. Parker and inform her of these plans.

The next problem discussed is in Big Four Arch sub-division at #1705, where Mr. Elmore, who resides there, reported a drainage problem. Bob Thayer said there is an underground spring out there, that perpetuates the drainage problem, and that there has been a problem there before. Harvey said he would go out and take a look at it and that he would investigate any past problems in this area. Sam said that we should have an ordinance passed that any sub-division should be inspected by the surveyor. Bob Thayer agreed that these laws should be upgraded. There being no further business, the meeting was

adjourned at 4:00 p.m.

The Montgomery County Drainage Board met Tuesday, May 29, 1990, 1:30 P.M., Commissioners Office, Courthouse, Crawfordsville, Indiana.

Those present were as follows:

James Kirtley, Chairman; Sam Kessler, Vice-Chairman; Bob Thayer, Member; Don Schmidt, Board Attorney; Harvey Keller, Surveyor; Honorable Phil Michaels, Mayor(2:10 P.M.); Sue MIller, City of Crawfordsville; Horace Tomey, Robert Shaw, Roberta Snyder, Guy McCance, Sanford Boraker, Eddie Morphew, Lucile Gilstrap, Charlie Sayler and Mike Whitecotten; Mark Runkal, Woolpert Consultants of Indianapolis and Pat Cline, reporter for Journal Review.

Chairman, James Kirtley, called the meeting to order. Landowners were here to discuss the <u>William T. Shelley</u> Drain.

Surveyor, Harvey Keller, reported the following: Shelley Drain was constructed in 1909.

Consists of 543 acres.

Length is 23,070 feet of tile.

This drain has been classified as a legal drain.

Drain begins approximately at Elmore Street and 200 East.

Drain eventually outlets behind Raymark as an open drain at the Railroad tracks.

A petition was carried by Mr. Mead, but landowners voted against this.

There are structures built over this drain, also trees & shrubs.

The county approached the city to take over this drain, and the City has refused.

A legal drain can be located inside the city limits, without the City taking responsibility to keep it in good repair.

Vice-Chairman, Sam Kessler, reported that a petition can be filed with the Drainage Board if it contains the signatures of 10% of the acres in the involved watershed.

But to be reconstructed a drain petition must have 51% of the acres in agreement.

Other items discussed were:

(a) Building a storm sewer line from Traction Road to 32 East.

(b) The drainage problems get greater as more buildings are being constructed. When this drain was originally built it served its purpose which was to drain farmland. But with the growth of the city of Crawfordsville, the drain is not large enough to serve as a storm water system and farm drainage.

(c) Building done without authorization. In particular Montgomery Place Condominiums. (owned by Montgomery Savings Association). M.S.A. did approach the drainage board before the building started. They ask the Drainage Board to reduce the drain right-of-way from 75 feet to 10 feet. The Board denied this request. Both parties agreed to a 25 foot right-of-way. The Shelley Drain was rerouted from the woods behind the First Baptist Church, located on 32 East, in a northerly direction to 32 East.

Attorney, Don Schmidt, reminded Mr. Tomey, of his previous legal opinion which was:

(1) get a temporary injunction against M.S.A.

(2) hire an engineer to study the water problem, then take the case to court and the county could be made co-defendants.
(d) Harvey reminded landowners that our Office deals with legal drains that are on assessment. Work done on legal drains is with money that landowners pay to maintain a specific drain.

(e) The work the city did on this drain was discussed. The Shelley was cleaned (water jetted) from Eastern Acres to State Road 32 East.

(f) In dry weather the Shelley tile runs 1/2 full of water.

(g) Landowners remarked that they need the Shelley Drain plus a storm water drain. They also ask if some water from (behind B & D Lumber & Shop Wright Grocery) could be re-routed in the side ditch of Traction Road to Walnut Creek (near Traction Auto Parts). The Surveyor reported that the side ditches are the responsibility of the County Highway Department.

(h) Mr. Michaels stated that from Traction Road to State Road
32, the tile is too small. The tile should be at least 24
inch, maybe a 36 inch. Bob Thayer reported the tile in this
area is a 15 inch tile and approximately 1/2 mile long.
(i) Mr. Tomey ask if a retention pond would help relieve some

(i) Mr. Tomey ask if a retention pond would help relieve some of the problems. Attorney replied that an engineer should be consulted to answer this.

Mr. Tomey reported he would carry a petition. The Surveyors Office will provide a petition, a drainage map and a list of landowners. The Surveyor reported the list of landowners will take some time to put together.

2:40 P.M.

Mike Whitecotten was here to discuss an addition to the east side of Twin Oaks Subdivision. The addition consists of approximately 4.5 acres or 9 building lots. This area is drained by a 15 inch tile. The subdivision will install the drain tile.

(b) WILLIAM EPPERSON DRAIN.

Harvey reported he had walked and inspected the entire ditch.

There are five areas needing rip-rap, approximately 483 feet, estimating 15 to 20 tons @\$1750.00. The Board discussed contract modification #3 needs to be drafted.

7) Member, Bob Thayer, reported that probably the only way to solve Lindens problems once and for all would be to lay a new tile line and property owners would not be happy as this would be a very costly project. Bob also stated he is very concerned with the spongy lawn (at Vollmers) near the side walk.

EPPERSON DRAIN

The board signed the contract modifications on the Epperson Drain. Ron Taylor was the contractor.

This money is coming from the Nucor Fund. There is a drainage problem involving, Nucor, Estel McCloud and Louis Fellows. Mr. McCloud doesn't want anything done. Larry is to meet with Dave Sulc & Joe Cox to discuss if a new tile line would be beneficial. Then Larry will discuss options with the Drainage Board. LEVI HAWKINS DRAIN

Chairman, James Kirtley, called the meeting to order.

This meeting is the hearing date for reconstruction of the Levi Hawkins Drain.

The Chairman ask the Surveyor to take the floor and conduct the meeting.

Harvey reported the following items: Original construction was 1905.

Length is 750 feet of open drain, 3,210 feet tile in the line, and one main tributary with 1,950 feet of tile. main Sizes of tile vary from 14 to 22 inch. Acres in watershed is 861.18.

Located in the Southwest part of the County, approximately 1 mile South of the entrance of the Shades State Park. 9 landowners in the watershed.

The following items were discussed:

a) Several landowners wrote objections to the project.

b) On the Campbell Farm there are 10 - 11 very large holes in the tile line.

The Surveyors Office has had no report of broken tiles c) until three years ago.

d) Current balance in the drainage fund is \$879.96.

The Assessment was \$400.00 per year established December 11, 1972.

Assessment was revised October 23, 1989 to \$1,600.00 per year.

e) The petition to reconstruct was received March 30, 1990.

f) After thorough field study the engineers estimated project cost is \$35,068.45 add in the 10% and the total cost is \$38,575.30.

g) Rosentreters object to being in the watershed. Stating due to a hill his water drains the opposite direction.

h) Larry reported he did a site inspection with George Reger, Joe Phelps and Gordon Holloway, on Rosentreters Holloway, on property. They found the following items:

1) surface water drains to this open ditch

the open ditch was at one time a waterway (now long 2) neglected)

3) at the road the culvert is almost washed out.

4) will check when crops are out.

i) Harvey stated that Rosentreters sub surface water drains to the West (thus using the Hawkins Drain).

Rosentreter responded that due to a retaining wall the water can not run west. He was not in agreement with Harvey & Larrys findings.

Vice-Chairman, Sam Kessler, stated that the determining factor is which way the surface water runs.

j) The Surveyor presented photos to the landowners.k) Drainage maps and profiles of the drain were presented to the Board and landowners for inspection and review.

1) The reconstruction plans include some of the following:

a) remove existing headwall

b) lay a new 24 inch plastic tile line.c) outlet will be a 27" corrugated steel pipe with a rock shute.

d) fence off the outlet for protection from cattle etc.

Campbell Farms, Farm Manager, Carl Litten reported that for the past 15 years they have at their own expense kept the tile in good repair.

0.C. Bennett ask who was suppose to check on the legal drain. Vice-chairman, Sam Kessler, reported it is thelandowners duty to report problems to the county Surveyor or the County Commissioners.

Mr. Weber reported that from 1959 to 1975 he ask for approximately \$100.00 per year he kept the Campbell Farms tile in good repair. Then rules changed and county had to oversee the contractors (due to liability insurance). One contractor billed the County for \$1,100.00 and did very shabby work.

County Attorney, Don Schmidt, reported if landowners could agree among themselves they could have work done and not go thru any county office. But once the county is do rise as more people and more paper work. involved, costs gets involved.

Landowners ask who signed petition: Harvey reported Clore and Campbell Farms.

Mr. Klepfer went on to report the outlet was in poor shape and the drain needs to be extended.

Chairman, James Kirtley, called the meeting to order.

Harvey Keller discussed the James Hose Drain at great length and reported the following items:

1) Mr. Watkins bid for repairs and tree removal around the outlet (near the railroad tracks) was \$2,380.00. He has repaired 3 tile holes and redid some very large cracks in the tile. Harvey presented photos for the Board to review. Watkins then moved on to Vollmer's property. After 2) uncovering this tile it was discovered that extensive work could be involved.

Harvey then reported that we are at our limit of the money Harvey approximated it would take \$2,000.00 to we borrowed. finish the job. We need to get this work done ASAP. The Board agreed and instructed Harvey & Watkins to finish the work. Bob Thayer stated we would need to borrow more money. Chuck Watkins replied he would wait on his money.

(3) Work on this drain is difficult as the Hose and Town tile are located directly on top of one another. In the vicinity of Brett Pennington's property, a total of 80 feet of tile have been placed, 40 feet on each drain. The new tile is solid plastic.

At Pennington's property a garage is placed directly over the tile and a large tree is growing there also. The Board recommended removing the tree.

4) Harvey reported he has found 47 obstacles located within 25 feet of the drain easement and some located directly over the tile listed as follows : 9 large trees, 13 medium trees, 9 small trees, 4 bushes, 4 garages, 5 homes and 3 mobile homes.

The Board discussed at great length the removal of the tree and garage at Pennington's property. But later decided to not make any firm decision until the Attorney could be consulted.

The Board set Friday, August 31, 1:00 P.M. to review the Hose Drain.

<u>William Epperson Drain</u> Harvey reported Ron Taylor is working on the Epperson There is a total of \$9.313.00 to be used on Drain. thisdrain.

The lower end is sandy and eroding. Harvey proposes to rip-rap 1100 feet and Ron Raylor has agreed to do the work. Harvey was instructed to prepare a contract to this effect. Work will start at the railroad and go up 1,100 feet.

The Montgomery County Drainage Board met Friday, August 31, 1990, 1:00 P.M., Commissioners Room, Courthouse, Crawfordsville, Indiana.

Those attending were as follows: Chairman, James Kirtley; Vice-Chairman, Sam Kessler; Member, Bob Thayer; Attorney, Don Schmidt; Surveyor, Harvey Keller; Jim Hamilton of Butler-Fairman & Sefert and Landowner, Boyd Hudson arriving at 1:30 P.M.

Chairman, James Kirtley, called the meeting to order. Harvey reported several items needing immediate attention of the Board.

1) Harvey presented a letter to the Board that was sent to Mr. Pennington and surrounding landowners.

2) Balance in the Hose Drain is \$47.13. Harvey ask if we were to wait until after the hearing (which is set for October 15, 1990 1:30 P.M.) before we proceed with doing any more work on this Hose Drain? Board recommended proceeding with replacing a total of 80 feet of tile (this will be 40 feet on the Hose and 40 feet on the old town tile). Watkins has agreed to wait until after settlements for payment of their work and the Board concurred with this.

3) Harvey explained his method of calculations on the drain. Sixty percent of the acres are located outside Linden city limits. The drain is not figured on a benefit basis. Anything under 1 acre will be charged \$15.00 and agricultural property is figured at \$15.00 per acre. If landowners accept this proposal the maintenance fund will go from \$1,670.00 to \$9,700.00 per year.

4) The Board ask if any trees had been removed? Harvey responded no, but the roots have been severed 5 feet from the tile and solid plastic tile has replaced the old bell tile.

Harvey again reported that 47 obstacles are directly on the tile line. North of Parker's property there is a garage on the tile line.

The Board instructed Harvey in the following items: 1) Landowners need to remove the garage at their own expense. If the landowners opt to they can pay back in installents if the county has the structure removed.

2) Harvey is to prepare a letter to Penningtons with the name of landowner-legal description-name of the drain-and to state there is no feasible way to resolve the water problems without repairing the tile and stating the building is in the way of doing the repairs.

3) Ask landowners to dedicate 5 feet on either side of the legal drain (Hose) to the county for the purpose of future tile repairs if needed.

4) State a reasonable deadline (for removal of the structure) Board decided on 10 days.

5) The attorney will notify Mr. Pennington via certified letter. The Attorney also stated that the Board will handle all problems on drains on a one to one basis. The Board set October 15th, 1990 for the Hose Drain hearing date. Due to the size of the watershed the hearing will be held in the Superior Courtroom on Third Floor.

CHARLES NEWKIRK DRAIN

Boyd Hudson ask the Board to concur with separating the Newkirk & Hall Drainage area. Harvey reported he has redefined the Newkirk watershed. The watershed will now consist of 597.3 acres. (349.5 acres will be omitted)

consist of 597.3 acres. (349.5 acres will be omitted) Boyd stated that the Newkirk should consist of the East and West tile lines only and North of County Road 700. He went on to state that when the Hall was reconstructed it included the Newkirk in its reconstruction.

Boyd has been researching the drainage minutes (reference Book 4-page 124) Minutes state \$2,500.00 should be transferred to the Newkirk Drain from the Joseph Hall Drain. Because the repairs were actually done on the Hall Drain. This transfer was never done. Board instructed the Secretary to make said transfer after October 15 (hearing date). But after further research Mr. Hudson says the transfer should be only \$1,600.00.

transfer should be only \$1,600.00. Yearly assessment now is \$742.00 and we have been repairing at the rate of \$1,000.00 per year.

Mr. Hudson stated that he has been double assessed since 1983. And we need to straighten out a bad situation. Boyd also stated that the Newkirk is in need of reconstruction but there is no talk of that now.

Mr. Husdons revised acres will be 44.08 . The Attorney stated that we will need to advertise and

hold a public hearing on the matter of changing the watershed acres and dollar amounts.

The Board set October 15, 1990 for hearing date on the Charles Newkirk Drain.

WILLIAM EPPERSON DRAIN

The money to spend on this drain totals \$9,314.00. Harvey reported this will be used entirely for rip-rap on the lower end. 530 tons will be placed 5 feet high (along both banks) and at a depth of 1 foot. This drain has a lot of fall. When Nucor flushes the holding pond the water in the drain rises 1 foot.

Harvey presented the contract modification to the Board. The Board will do a final inspection of this drain. No date for inspection was set at this meeting.

380 feet of 8 inch tile on tributary # 2 has been replaced. Around the area of 150 South and 250 East.

There has been a problem there with water standing on property owned by Walt Nelson.

Mr. Nelson wanted to place another tributary into the main line.

Harvey had some difficulty in locating the ditch in the road r-o-w. But after finding said tile he also discovered raw sewerage in the tile line.

They tried a roto rooter but there was not enough pressure to do any good. So Contractor, Chuck Watkins was called in. Watkins quoted \$800.00 to do repairs. The Board stated they were paying for an outlet. Bob Thayer moved and Sam Boots seconded a motion to leave the Newkirk drainage assessments as is. Motion unanimous. Reference Book 4, page 21 Date: September 19, 1983 Mr. Hudson was in attendance to discuss the Newkirk and Hall drainage assessments. Landowners in the Newkirk are paying a double assessment. Sam Boots moved and Bob Thayer seconded a motion instructing the Surveyor, Russ Nelson to refigure the Hall Drain maintenance assessments. Landowners in the Newkirk watershed will pay 75 cents per acre in the Newkirk Drainage Book 4 page 124 Date: May 30, 1989 Mr. Boyd Hudson was here to discuss the Charles Newkirk and Joseph Hall Drains.

Mr. Hudson ask that the Board correct the following items:

(a) acres and assessment amounts for the Newkirk and Hall. The September 19, 1983 drainage minutes set the maintenance assess of the Hall Drain at \$.75 per acre (Newkirk assessment is the same amount)

(b) to redefine the watershed of the Newkirk Drain.

(c) \$2500.00 should be transferred to the Newkirk maintenance fund. (this money should have come from the Hall Drain)

When the Joseph Hall Drain was reconstructed in 1982 it encroached on the Charles Newkirk Drain. In some locations the Newkirk and Hall are the same ditch.

Old records state that the Newkirk Drain starts 958 feet East of the center of Section 29, Township 19 North, Range 4 West, and runs due North. Mr. Hudson states the -conti-September 13, 1990

Newkirk now consists of 2 tile line running East and Wast and all located North of County Road 800 north. The Board was in agreement with Mr. Hudson and

requested the Surveyor to do a field check and report back with Mr. Hudson."

The Board felt that this is the point where we are now. The Board and Mr. Hudson reviewed the drainage map very thoroughly.

Auditor, Nell Hester, was ask to the meeting to review the drainage assessment statements.

Those attending were as follows: Chairman, James Kirtley; Vice-Chairman, Sam Kessler (10:23); Member, Bob Thayer; Surveyor, Harvey Keller; 1st Deputy Surveyor, Larry Utz; Pat Cline, Journal Review; Tom Ackman, WCVL Radio and the following South Montgomery High School students, Kelly Achtabowski, Travis Winford and Jason Cottrell.

Chairman, James Kirtley, called the meeting to order. The Surveyor, has been contacted by Roy Leaders. (Allen Lewis Drain).

Mr. Leaders states that ever since the County Highway has replaced a culvert pipe, he has had water problems.

Harvey reported water comes in at one angle and pipes are at another (off 30 degrees) causing water to go to the side ditch. The problem is with surface water run off.

Larry reported he had talked to Contractors, Dennis and Rex Phillips, (no one is sure who hired the contractor to do the work) but a portion of tile have been re-routed due to buried telephone cable at the culvert.

Harvey has researched the records and cannot find the tile repairs done thru this office.

Harvey stated he didn't know how costly it would be to change the culvert pipes - to turn them South 45 degrees or to place an extension on the ends.

Harvey recommended both landowners, Roy Leaders and Dave Nesbitt talk to S.C.S. Office. If a grass waterway is the best solution, the S.C.S. Office will cost share the project.

Harvey went on to state that the land needs to be reshaped on both sides of the road. But will need for the crops to be out to make a valid assessment of the situation.

Bob Thayer reported the Commissioners have been to this site several times. When the pipes were put in 2 culvert pipes replaced the existing one and the roadway and pipes were lowered. Dave Deckard has worked for Mr. Leaders but Deckard has not gotten back with The Board on his findings.

10:23 A.M., Sam Kessler and the three South Montgomery students attended the meeting. Chairman, James Kirtley, briefly explained the duties of the Drainage Board and explained we take care of maintenance of approximately 220 legal drains.

First Deputy, Larry Utz, reported Leaders had contacted him reporting water had taken out his fence and he would not replace it until this problem was resolved, and he has planted crops three times due to high water.

Harvey reported the pipes should be placed in a southwesterly direction and are already 1/2 full of silt. There are 400 acres draining to the culvert. Harvey recommended an extension on the pipes under the road, a grass waterway on the East side of road, and a box culvert.

The Board stated that surface water is not a problem of legal drains.

Chairman, James Kirtley, instructed the Surveyor to

investigate further, and report back to the Board. Larry reported on the <u>Clifton J. Coon Drain</u>. Located 1,000 West and 700 North. This is a joint drain with Fountain County. The problem area lies in Montgomery County. The tile makes 3 sharp turns before going into the road culvert. A portion of the side ditch has been filled in and a landowner has planted trees and flowers in that filled in portion.

Kessler ask the account balance - we did not have that information with us.

The agreement was for Linden to maintain all tributarys (in the town tile and Hose Drain) and keep debris and ice cleaned from the storm grates.

Since June of 1985 thru present, \$6,270.00 has been spent to maintain this drain system.

i. Spring settlement 1990 was \$1,388.00. A field check of the drain was reported as follows:

At the outlet one of the 18" tiles was not running much (1)water. The only problem found at this site was, some willows growing and 1 broken tile. The town tile should run water only after a rain fall. (2) A sink hole had started

in Betty Parkers driveway. Property located 217 East Walnut Street. The Surveyor and 1st Deputy started checking behind the house and rerouted the tile (part of the town tile system). When the tile was ready to be reconnected. Tile was off grade. This problem was corrected.



Sam Kessler ask if there was money in the fund to cover the costs? Harvey: yes.

Sam Kessler recommended to proceed with said surface drain and rock shute. Board concurred unanimously.

Harvey went on to discuss that he did not like the S.C.S. Office intervening (as they did on the A.F. Ward Drain) with plans for a levee and expect the Surveyors Office to cost share in their projects.

Harvey also reported a problem in the Smartsburg area. Hobe Mennen and Mr. Dice have a dispute over a water problem. Mr. Dice's farm travel path causes water to stand on Mennens property. Mr. Dice has gravel and stone placed on the path and rains wash the same into the waterway on Mennens.

Harvey explained this is a civil matter as there are no legal drains in this area.

Mennens stated they would be coming to the Commissioners meeting this morning to discuss the matter. There being no further business, meeting recessed.

Bob Thayer ask approximately how much to do the necessary repairs. Harvey stated \$2,000.00 . Harvey also stated he wanted Jack Jones to do the job.

Those present were Chairman, James Kirtley; Vice-Chairman, Sam Kessler; Member, Bob Thayer; Surveyor, Harvey Keller; and Attorney, Don Schmidt. Mr. Schmidt did not stay for the entire meeting.

Chairman, James Kirtley, called the meeting to order.

Sam Kessler ask about the drain located on Highway 234 and County Road 200 East. Harvey reported this is the <u>Rankin Walkup Drain.</u> The Board reviewed photos of the drain. Contractor, Gary Layne, repaired this drain. There were 6 tile holes in 60 feet of the tile line. Several places were repaired and patched in the same place numerous times. Mr. Layne replaced 60 feet with plastic tile, removing all the old smaller repairs. Attorney, Don Schmidt, reviewed a letter to Mr. Ken

The Board reviewed a letter to S.C.S. Office regarding <u>Thomas Wilkens</u> - <u>Sarah Kincaid Drains</u>. Landowners are requesting to remove a section of the railway bed to clean and repair the tile outlet. Said railroad is now abandon. Darrell Birge, contractor, will be doing the repairs. Work has not started.

Harvey reported on the John McLaughlin Drain. Landowner, Mike Emmert, requested to straighten 1100 feet of this drain (open). S.C.S. Office states this is a wetland. Army Corp of Engineers requested further information be faxed to their office. Then they will make the final determination of a wetland or not.

A few landowners have shown interest in further hearings on the McLaughlin Drain for maintenance.

Ebenezer McClaskey Drain

A large tile hole was found 200 feet East of the County Road. An outlet was made at this point. (moving the original outlet). Jack Jones was the contractor. Outlet appears to be working very satisfactorily. Mr. Kessler stated he feels the rip-rap should be larger, so washouts will not occur.

<u>James Fleming Drain</u>

Forest Patton reported that storm damage has caused trees to fall on this drain. After a field inspection damage is south of the outlet (in Black Creek) not in the maintained portion of the legal drain. Mr. Patton does not agree with these findings. Harvey wrote Mr. Patton a letter stating county cannot remove the trees.

Levi Hawkins Drain

Contractor, Rex Wills, found a serious problem with this drain. Problem stems from wrapping tile joints with plastic trash bags. Harvey reported this is a practice no longer recommended or used by this office.

<u>Benjamin Crabbs Drain</u>

Contractor, E.B. Foster, is trimming and cutting brush on this drain. Harvey has requested Ed Barclay to remove the fence he has dumped in the drain or it will be removed at his expense. No reply has been received. Board agrees with the Surveyor. <u>Linn-Himes Drain</u>

Harvey stated that he has observed that when drains are sprayed, beavers tend to move. Two landowners on the Linn-Himes do not want the beavers or beaver lodges blasted or destroyed. They are involved in EPA.

<u>Joseph Hall Drain</u>

Harvey reported there is heavy growth on this drain. Landowners would like for some dredging to be done, but the money this year will be used to spray the banks. The Board requested Harvey to get prices on aerial spraying. Harvey reported that Rodeo is the only aquatic herbicide that can be applied.

Hobart Mennen reported that the banks were eroding and after further checking this is due to beaver lodges in banks fall in.

Mr. Kessler ask if the beaver lodge could be removed by excavating instead of blasting? Harvey reported in some cases, yes.

Lye Creek Drain

Marvin McBee requested an 18 inch x 100 foot pipe be installed. Harvey reported this seems to be doing a satisfactory job. Harvey also ask Mr. McBee to not farm too close to this area. Pipe installed by Chuck Watkins.

<u>John V. Galey Drain</u>

Located South and East of the City, includes part of the City GolF Course. Harvey reported behind Hi-Tek this drain is in bad condition. About 1,000 feet of 24 inch tile needs repaired. This is located on the northwest end of the drain.

<u>Alvin Sparks Drain</u>

Located 550 South, $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles east of Whitesville. An 18 inch tile is collapsing on Joed Linn property. This tile is approximately 90 years old.

Harvey presented photos showing its outlet into Potato Creek.

James B. Elmore Drain was constructed 1927. Located in Section 15, Township 18 North, Range 6 West, Ripley Township.

In 1967, former County Surveyor, Carroll Beeson, stated watershed consisted of 468 acres and recommended a 30 inch tile be used in Section 14 on Rush's property.

A portion of this is an open drain (thru Hughes & Drollinger property) then goes into a 16 inch tile for approximately 3/4 mile then back to an open drain and outlets at the Montgomery and Fountain County line.

The combining of these drains make a total of 1,160.50 acre watershed.

Harvey stated that in order to do any major work this drain will need to accumulate \$2,000.00 per year for at least 2 to 3 years then do some tile repair.

Mr. Hughes stated that for the past several years privately- landowners have been cost sharing major repairs. 1,000 feet have been dredged and cleared from Coats to Myers Farms. They have already made plans to repair tile on these properties. Landowners went on to discuss placing this drain on maintenance in 1993.

Harvey outlined the following as major items:

a) Lower 1/2 mile needs dredged and cleaned.

b) Repair all outlets into the main line.

c) all tile (the main line) needs replaced -- could perhaps parallel the old tile line.

d) build a retention pond.

e) this drain does not have much fall in the total length.

Landowners discussed the method of figuring assessments. Harvey explained the formula is based on usage of drain, benefits and damages. Twenty-three counties in Indiana use this method of calculation.

Twenty-two percent of the landowners did not attend this

Harvey concluded with the following:

Drain consists of 948 acres.

4,414 feet of open drain.

11,237 feet of tile (3 tile lines).

In 1983 maintenance was set at \$.75 per acre or \$725.00 per annum collected.

No one really knows when the Newkirk became being called Newkirk - another name was Prosser Lingerman Drain. But when the Joseph Hall Drain was reconstructed the open portion of the Charles Newkirk was dredged and included in the Joseph Hall watershed.

The hearling today will determine the watershed as 597 acres (all other acres will be in the Joseph Hall Watershed Tributary #1.)

Balance of Newkirk Drain is \$2,882.86 (9-17-91).

Balance of Hall Drain is \$9,394.91 (9-17-91.

Boy Hudson stated at one time he discussed that the Drainage Board should transfer funds (from Hall to Newkirk Drains) in the amount of \$2,500.00. This transfer was never done. Now he stated a more reasonable amount would be \$500.00 to \$1,000.00.

Mrs. Denhart asked that now that the open ditch is no longer a part of the Newkirk Drain, shouldn't everone's yearly assessment go down? Harvey replied, "Yes, now that there is only 597 acres, everone's assessment will drop. However, the \$.75 per acre charge will remain the same. You just will not be paying on as many acres."

Bob Thayer moved and Sam Kessler seconded a motion to designate the Newkirk Drain as consisting of 3 tile lines and setting the maintenance assessment at \$.75 per acre. Motion unanimous.

Mrs. Denhart discussed repairs needing done at the railroad tracks. She also gave the Surveyor several photos showing the area.

Chairman, James Kirtley, called the meeting to order.

Mr. Gaylor was here to discuss the <u>George Nichols Drain</u>. Drain is located east side of Linden. The tile is cut thru a hill - could be as deep as 17 feet. Harvey tried to locate the tile late last fall. Mr. Gaylor ask if the County Highway Dept would dump and level dirt in a low spot located off of road 1000 North. Approximately 2 acres is to wet to till. Ponding has occurred since the Nichols Drain was reconstructed. (1977-1978). Mr. Kessler reported Highway Dept. would deliver and dump fill dirt but usually does not level. Board recommended Mr. Gaylor discuss this with County Engineer, Larry Scott.

Mr. Gaylor and other landowners felt they had spent enough money and opted to do no work at that time. Mr. Gaylor's reconstruction cost was \$10,000.00 plus \$200.00 per year maintenance assessment.

County Surveyor, Harvey Keller, reported and recommended the following:

1) Maintenance fund balance (George Nichols Drain) \$1230.00

2) Clear brush & trees on drain right of way (total of 150 feet in width).

3) As weather permits the tile line will be probed and documented.

4) Remove Mr. Gaylors name from the maintenance assessment roll for 1992 as he is receiving no benefits from this drain.

Sam Kessler moved and Bob Thayer seconded a motion to remove Mr. Dean Gaylors name from the assessment roll for the year of 1992, until such a time improvements are made and he starts receiving benefits from this drain. This matter will be reviewed for 1993. Motion unanimous.

Discussion of the George Nichols Drain continued as follows: 1) Approximately \$600.00 to clear brush and trees

2) Entire watershed is 400 acres.

3) There are no visible signs of sink holes or broken tiles.

4) Tile sizes range from 10" - 450 feet; 12" - 650 feet; tile continues to get larger until at the outlet at the railroad it is a 20" tile.

3.Attorney, Don Schmidt and Mike McCormick are working on certificate of insurance from Midwest Mole Company (which will be boring under CSX Railroad). A copy of certificate is to be on file before work is started. Liability is to be at lease 2 million dollars.

4.State Highway has granted permission for entry onto right-ofway during construction.

Work is also planned on <u>Kenneth Hudson Drain</u>, located in Elmdale. We need to dig in the road to locate the tile. Water is boiling up at the surface inlets. There are 3 trees next to the tile and this could be part of the problem.

Moore's Heights Drain. The outlet needs some work. The pipe is damaged and approximately 50 feet of tile will be added. We will be removing some tile from the side ditch.

John Gobin Drain. Located on 231 North and north of the railroad overpass. The plans will be finished this fall.

<u>Stanford-Elmore Drain</u>. Needs 1,000 feet of new tile and 1,000 feet of open drain reconstructed.

The Montgomery County Drainage Board met Tuesday, September 15, 1992, 1:35 P.M., Commissioners Office, Courthouse, Crawfordsville, Indiana.

Those attending were: Chairman, James Kirtley; Vice-Chairman, Sam Kessler; Member, Bob Thayer; Surveyor, Harvey Keller; 2nd Deputy Surveyor, Ann Addler; and the following landowners, Mariko Knox, representing Heritage Products (B. Crabbs Drain); Lawrence Dye (Wal-Mart); James McCutchan and Morris Berry (C. Widener Drain).

Chairman, James Kirtley, called the meeting or order, 1:35 P.M.

A hearing for reconstruction and maintenance was held on the Benjamin Crabbs Drain.

The Surveyor, Harvey Keller, presented a map of the watershed and gave the following information:

a) Acres in watershed - 831.

b) Landowners number 24.

c) One third of the watershed is industrial or business.

d) Drain was construction 1905 and reconstructed 1936.

e) Drain consists of 5,750 feet of open drain and 7,709 feet of tile. Tile consists of 3 tributaries.

f) Drain is located north and east of Interstate 74 and Highway 231 North. Drain starts near Brick Yard Road then goes westerly and north emptying into Black Creek.

g) Petition was carried by Mr. Charles DeVore.

h) 72% (of acres involved) signed the petition.

i) Cost of reconstruction is estimated to be \$18,486.67.

j) Maintenance is proposed to be \$1940.00 per year.

Tentative plans include: placing rip-rap and dipping out the bottom of the channel (open drain).

Harvey reported there are 8 rolls of fence wire dumped in the open drain, plans are to bury the old fencing.

Mariko Knox, representing Heritage Products, and the Surveyor discussed and reviewed the drainage map at great length. Ms. Knox stated Heritage is really more concerned with a new drain going to be named <u>Park 74</u> Drain. This drain will be ready for a public hearing in January of 1993.

Harvey reminded the Board that to proceed with this reconstruction a loan will be needed as the Improvement Fund does not have enough money to cover the project. Board agreed. Sam Kessler moved and Bob Thayer seconded a motion to

Harvey reported to the Board on the James Hose Drain. In Northfield Subdivision, Tipmont R.E.M.C. hit a tile in the James Hose Drain. Size of tile is 27". The depth is 3-1/2 to 4-1/2feet. Tipmont will pay for the repairing of this. Tile did not break - but they set a pole in the tile. While investigating this problem, it was discovered Melody Homes ran a sewer line into the Hose Drain. Harvey requested this be changed. The <u>Stanford-Elmore Drain</u> was discussed.

The following information was reported.

Hendricks County has not paid any reconstruction cost. They 6) firmly state that construction was (1988) not properly done. And also they have no drainage problems.

One being that a tile was capped off (located on the western end of the drain) and after brush was removed on (C. Boersma property) tile was so old a section of the old line collapsed.

Harvey recommended the following:

Replace entire tile line. Running a new line parallel to the 1) existing line.

2) replace pipe and angle of the pipe under 1000 South. Present line has two 90% angles where pipe crosses under the road.

Install a grass waterway. Due to contour of the land, there is a tremendous amount of surface water drainage in this area.

The Board recommended Harvey try to work with Hendricks County Surveyor, Neal Ott.

Alan Plunkett moved and Paul Dickson seconded a motion requesting James Kirtley contact Hendricks County Drainage Board and set a date for a meeting of our two drainage boards. Also, to attend will be the surveyors and county engineers.

Mr. Drollinger stated he pays too big a percent 21.5 %. Нe also stated he pays over \$5,000.00 in taxes. \$486.00 in drainage assessments. He stated he needs an outlet first then he wanted his drainage assessment percent adjusted.

Harvey stated that at the hearing (Sept 9,1991) landowners had 3 choices of how the drain could be figured and landowners opted for the damages and benefit method. Landowners felt that this was the most fair way to cost share. The three choices were: a) per acre cost. b) per cent of total cost or c) benefit and damages.

Harvey went on to state that he figures reconstruction costs on a damages and benefit method. There really is no flat percent used to figure anybodies fee. Those on the upper end of a drain will pay more because they use more of the total length of the drain.

Chairman, Paul Dickson, as $k^{\rm cl}$ if Harvey could refigure this watershed. Harvey replied that he will re-evaluate the total

watershed.

to inspect this problem and work with Mr. Keim. <u>BENJAMIN CRABBS DRAIN:</u> Harvey introduced Dave Deckard to Board. Then he showed map of area and outlined features of Heritage's intentions for a future gravel pit and asphalt plant. Harvey told Board that Lew Davis of Heritage Group was planning to build this operation across this drain, but not for 1-2 years. Heritage also wants the drain reconstructed according to the contract.

Heritage will build a lake from the gravel pit and provide an inlet for the drain and an outlet into Black Creek and to maintain proper water levels for the drain.

Deckard explained it will take 10-12 years before the boundary of the lake will be established. The excavation will be for a gravel pit. The water quality should be improved, water table should not be affected, and volume of water will increase and the lake should act as a large detention pond.

Deckard stated that he met with Larry Scott and he stated that according to the drainage ordinance we should not need a full drainage study to meet the requirements, but submit a letter of planned intent and water table runoffs that would suffice.

Keller stated that he believes landowners want the reconstruction to take place.

DeVore asked if Heritage had committed in writing what will happen. Answer - no.

Keller said that 1800 feet or so will remain after the pit is constructed.

Devore wants everything down in writing.

Schmidt stated that we either go on with the reconstruction or County will stop here and have Heritage dredge it out. Keller stated that contractor Jack Jones will start reconstruction work after he completes a bridge project in Fountain County.

Deckard will see to it that Heritage puts these requests in writing.

Keller requested to go ahead upon receiving written notice from Heritage of intent. Jones has the go-ahead for work when he is ready to begin.

The Board voted on this unanimously.

Schmidt reminded Heritage to abide by Law #5.

<u>JAMES HOSE DRAIN:</u> Keller stated that Senator Lugar's staff has arrange a meeting of officials to meet on this drain come Thursday, Feb. 11 at 11:00 AM at the Linden Town Hall. Keller and Commissioners will attend

<u>ALBERT HYSONG DRAIN:</u> Kirtley told Keller to telephone the Hendricks County Surveyor and arrange a meeting ASAP.

<u>PHILLIP DEWEY DRAIN:</u> Keller sent Mike Spencer (Tippecanoe County Surveyor) a letter asking to re-form the joint drainage board for the reconstruction of this drain. Board should form ASAP.

JOHN McLAUGHLIN DRAIN: Clinton County wants to place this on maintenance. Keller told them that some landowner in the water shed should carry a petition to do so.

<u>CHARLES McFARLAND DRAIN:</u> Keller gave specs to Larry Scott to draft plans for boring under State Highway 32 West and send to State Highway Office for approval.

Chairman Paul Dickson called the meeting to order.

<u>Clarence Widener Ditch</u>: Mr. Bayless, representative for Hazel Newkirk, complained that they were never notified of reconstruction letter. He wanted to know why the ditch was reconstructed through her land without their knowing about it. He stated that a fence was removed and trees removed too.

Contractor Dave Foster stated that he received permission from farm tenant Dale Cottrell to enter across his land. The fence was old and already had holes in it. No valuable trees were removed. Homer Wilkinson is gathering firewood from fallen trees.

Harvey stated when locating landowners in the beginning, Rick Tanner's name was on card at owning the Newkirk land and that is why they were not notified.

<u>Urshull Cross Ditch</u>: Board discussed preliminary plans between County and Mr. Cain. Cain states waterway has been widened and a new channel built by them. They are willing to do own work but will need help with funding for culvert pipes (relocation of old and new.) Don Schmidt recommends Cains can do anything they want to their property and County will perform work on County property. Because of liability and insurance the two parties will coordinate their work efforts. Larry Scott stated that County Road 925 E. is in the Thoroughfare Plan.

<u>George Hutchison Drain</u>: Harvey read letter from Claude Ridge asking to be removed from drain assessment role. Assessment is \$111.00 per year on 69.5 acres. Plunkett makes motion to deny request to withdraw from assessment. Kirtley seconds motion. Paul Dickson informs that motion is unanimous and carried. Board will send Mr. Ridge a letter to this affect.

In another matter, Harvey stated that the 22 inch tile that broke down under County Road 600W at Division Rd. was not the responsibility of the Surveyor to repair. Since the drain was private and/or vacated, it is the responsibility of the landowner to repair at their cost. Should a tile break down under a county road, it is up to the County Highway Dept. to repair it. Harvey warned that the Highway should allocate money for these types of repairs. There have been three (3) in the past six (6) months. Homer Cox, Highway Supt., filled the hole with stone until the back-ordered tile arrives.

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Montgomery/Tippecance Joint Drainage Board March 30, 1993 10:40 A.M.

The Montgomery/Tippecanoe County Joint Drainage Board met on Tuesday March 30, 1993 at 10:40 A.M., Commissioners Office, Room 103, Courthouse, Crawfordsville, Indiana.

Those attending were: Montgomery County Commissioners, Paul Dickson, Allen Plunkett, James Kirtley: Tippecanoe County Commissioners, William Haan and Nola Gentry; Attorney Don Schmidt; Montgomery County Surveyor, Harvey Keller; Tippecanoe County Surveyor, Mike Spencer; Montgomery County Drainage Board Secretary, Melissa Spencer.

The meeting was called to order at 10:40 A.M.

<u>Phillip Dewey Drain</u>: In April 1990, Landowners in Montgomery County and Tippecanoe County petition to extend the drain. (6 people signed the petition) Harvey Keller explained the boundaries in Montgomery County and Tippecanoe County. If passage of this project goes it will include the <u>Miller/McBeth Drain</u> and the <u>Gobin</u> <u>Drain</u>. Harvey Keller has worked up a set of plans and has aerial photos. The estimated cost of the project is \$106,264.21 for reconstruction. For periodic maintenance we estimate \$4,280.00 per year.

Mike Spencer stated that when a hearing was held in 1988, landowners voted "no" for a maintenance fund. There are landowners now who wish that a maintenance fund be established. There are 12 (twelve) landowners in Tippecanoe county on the <u>Miller/McBeth</u> <u>drain.</u>

Harvey Keller asked if <u>Miller/McBeth</u> was going to be under reconstruction at the same time as maintenance was taking place. He stated that the outlet to <u>Miller/McBeth</u> is in bad shape a lot of trees are present (some rather large) and the water bubbles up. The fall does not present a problem.

Commissioner Dickson stated that he has a lot of knowledge about this land- it has no bottom and has had fire problems in the past. He then asked if this ditch had been dug out in the last 15 (fifteen) years. Harvey Keller stated that the ditch was constructed in 1893 and reconstructed in 1978. Paul Dickson asked the commissioners present what they propose.

Don Schmidt said that we must have a joint board with Tippecance County. There must also be a board member from a nonaffected county on this board. Commissioner Disney from Hendricks County has agreed to serve in that capacity. Landowners must be notified of the joint meeting. He then asked if we will have to change the petition. Commissioner Gentry stated that they must combine the petition and create a joint drainage board. Don Schmidt stated that he will meet with Fred (attorney) of Tippecance County and go over old petitions and papers. We will then hold a public meeting to create a joint drainage board. The cost to each landowner will be based on per acre size and per lot size.

The next step is to touch base on permits, check with Steve Woll (SCS), check with the Department of Natural Resources on wetlands and the Army Corp of Engineers.

Paul Dickson called the meeting to order. Keller discussed the Jesse Snoddy Drain, located north of Alamo. Ten acres of water ponding in Dunlap's field. Water draining very slowly. There is a valve gate that controls water runoff and backing up in the tile.

Utz-said he and contractor Mike Merritt walked the drain and found several tile holes below the pond near the outlet. One hole is 20 ft. in diameter and in quicksand. Tile is full of sand. Claude Barker is to come in and jet-spray line before tile is repaired. Tile line is 18" diameter.

Tile is combination of clay and concrete tile. Barker wants to jet-spray 500 ft.. Rush argued that the tile should be fixed first before spraying. Utz said Barker needs outlet holes to do proper job before tile is fixed. Rush stated there are several blockages in the line that need checked. Barker will bring his own clean water to do work.

All parties were concerned about the outlet being clear for the spraying.

Rush said Bart Maxwell did work there 15 years ago and put in 300 ft. of 18' tile. Rush asked how much money was in the drainage fund. Utz stated \$4,700 was there.

Dunlap described how flapper gate worked in the manhole. Trash could be collecting in the gate as well. Rush asked how soon would this tile be fixed. Keller said ASAP.

Dunlap suggested the county place a long metal sewer pipe in the largest troubled area instead of plastic tile or concrete tile sections. The steel pipe will stay rigid and hold it's place. Rush stated that when the contractor comes out to work, the surveyor should have someone there to supervise the entire operation. Utz stated that Mike Merritt was to phone us everyday he is to work there, so we can be there. Barker will jet out the tile for \$2.00/foot.

Clarence Widener-Harvey pulled a final inspection on April 12th. Drain in good shape. We need to place four tons of rip-rap in farm crossing and a small sector of ditch bank has fallen, but is ok. Seeding is complete and some grass is growing. Some water is standing on the sides away from the ditch.

Benjamin Crabbs-Jack Jones has completed dredging-5,700 ft. Spoil has to be spread out and rip-rap placed yet. Then it will be finished.

Carper Crowder-EB Foster cleared trees out over tile. In 1986, Bart Maxwell placed 200 to 300 ft. of 24" plastic tile. He didn't

seal the joints and the tile popped up. Sink holes were created. The Co. Attorney notified Maxwell and he came back to replace and repair at no cost. The problems are coming back. Maxwell still didn't fix properly. We may need to fix in the near future again and it will be costly.

Basil VanCleave-in New Market, EB Foster is going to place 600 ft. plastic tile-18" and outlet. All topo shots and plans are complete. Lots of trees and roots in over tile. Will place new tile 10-15 ft. to the south and we will abandon the old the line. New Market has own sanitary sewer system, so no hook ups will be there to bother us.

Will N. Brown-Mr. Southard wants tile outlet moved from small stream to larger one near a weir structure, some 150 ft. away. Co. will do this.

Isaac Schotts-a 12" tributary tile line is full of dirt and we will replace it all with plastic tile.

John Wilkinson-problems with standing water. Co. Highway thought high water is tearing up the road. Our tile is 100 ft. farther south and is marked. We ran a 70 ft. spur of 6" tile to the north and placed a surface inlet in the lowest place. Some water damage to sub-base of road (425E) and a lot of heavy trucks are using this road, from Garfield to I-74.

Keller stated that we have 12 beaver dams to dynamite. It is costly no matter how we try to exterminate or chase them off our legal drains. We blow the lodges too.

We should remove food source by spraying brush, or removing brush. This problem is increasing.

Charles McFarland-plans drawn up and shown to Bruce Conrad of State Hwy Office. They have to draw up an agreement between us. This would mean we bid it, supervise it and they will pay for it.

Joseph Conway-Engineer Dave Deckard and Harvey drove and inspected this 3-mile open ditch. Deckard sent engineering estimate of \$7,000 for work to be done. Keller said it would cost roughly \$10 /foot or \$158,000 to reconstruct.

We have exchanged proposals of acceptance, Deckard's cost would not exceed 5.5% of total cost of reconstruction.

Head wall structure is gone and has about 10 acres of swampland there. Broken tile systems. Heavily wooded. Surveyor will contact Army Corps of Engineers and DNR. Landowners will bear all the costs.

<u>Ditch Spraying News;</u> - Keller said we have 10-15 ditches to be sprayed. Bids have never been taken in the past. What is the Board's feelings on bidding this work? Plunkett and rest of Board agrees that bids should be taken from now on. Keller will draft up a bid proposal.

Meeting adjourned at 10:15 a.m.

Residents along 136 concerned with drainage in area. Standing water a problem.

Harvey Keller-Surveyor-Drainage problem many years. Jennifer Nichols brought folder in with question submitted by land owners.

Problems with rains, Basement backup, Health Problems, Water standing under house, Insulation affected, Plumbing problem, Resale value decrease, Insert problems, Toilet backup.

Problems people are facing in this area between 136 and Oak Hill Rd.

Oak Hill Rd. side ditches bad. No side ditches in area. Keller talked to State Hwy about this problem. No record of any drains on file in this area. Keller stated drains used to be there (small ones) (sub surface only). Tiles were cut according to hear say when home built.

No percolation tests have been taken for years.

Tile running North was plugged up according to Walters.

Tile no longer working. 136 Hwy cleaned all this out at one time. Walters stated where 200W (Southside)intersects. Exploring constructing of ditch where property owner could pay. Tile to run to sub surface drain. Tile found North Center of area Mormon Church and 200 and tile that empties on 136.

Septic systems won't always work.

Walter said new construction of drainage needed in the area.

Cox has no work scheduled for 1993. Scott no experience in area.

Keller-area needs looked at and engineered. All underground utilities, septic.

Petition could be carried to build a legal drain in area or they could build and maintain drain themselves. Define water shed for citizens then citizens built and maintained themselves. Atty should be hired and cost divided among land owners.

If petition carried and passed.

All septic in back of property.

Blow Holes on private prop. Walters has not investigated.

Prop. Owners-Surveyed at one time 28" tile was once proposed. Prop. Owner-38 years lived there. No action. Raw sewerage being pumped out on ground. Health hazards exist here. Smells, Walters has had no calls on this. Surveyor and Co. Drain Bd. was going to put 12" tile all along prop. (1960)

1103 Waynetown Rd.-Pictures presented to Comm. to show drain problem. 18" culvert tile did not help.

Trenches have been dug to get water away from septic systems so they could flush toilets.

New septic systems will not help. Walters said drainage needed. Proper drainage on.

 $1\underline{st}$ step-Plunkett stated old tile needs to be located so it can be cleaned out.

Dickson stated to get a petition up and put proper drains in.

Keller stated prop. owners to come to him to draft a petition to be carried so a legal drain could be made. Many problems before this can be done.

County Surveyor (at the time) Don Yount was presented a construction proposal in 1976.

Ditches were cut when dirt scraped over by big equipment.

Ground not suited for drainage, Walters stated.

Drain Bd. function-to hear problems, then get answers.

Landowners wants follow through carried out this time.

Plugged up tile needs to be taken care of.

Chairman Paul Dickson called the meeting to order and asked Harvey Keller to speak first.

CLEARVIEW SUBDIVISION

Keller stated "We would liked to solve the problems while working with you (Landowners) and the City. One problem involved is that there is already an existing subdivision. Had it been preplanned, utilizing the County Drainage Codes, it would have been much easier as nothing can be approved until the drainage is satisfied. It will be more difficult, but not impossible as is."

Keller then presented aerial photos. Keller stated "The Foster-Fletcher drain is included on some landowners property. In the past few years on the ditch we have sprayed the brush and will clean more brush out. We have trouble around the headwall and some trouble with tile holes. Most of the land mass area is very flat. There are 800 acres where elevation doesn't vary 5 feet. Therefore, drainage will not move very fast."

Keller presented some level shots. There are 6.47 acres that drain out to the highway that's South of Hickory St. About 1/2 of the homes are taken in. Keller stated "Some problems we need to look at in this area are (1) Immediate surface water drainage (includes all homes.) (2) Flat yards (3) Culvert pipes buried (4) Side ditches are almost non-existent (5) Surface water run off. Another method - one that can be combined - is to go along where backyards meet and place a main line drain where backyards meet and along the road. Water in the center and South of the sub-division could be drained out to the highway. To the North, the water would still have to go towards the <u>Foster-Fletcher Drain</u>. For people who have assessments of \$3 - \$4 per year now, all that money goes for the upkeep of the drain. When these ditches were petitioned 100 years ago for a drain, they were petitioned to put in a main line. Alot of surface water is creating problems so the tile system can't handle this. One thing that might help solve the problem , but would take alot of time and study - and may not be forthcoming within the next year - would be to petition the courts for a new County drain. Not only one that would be with the <u>Foster</u> -<u>Fletcher Drain</u>, but would actually be a tributary of the <u>Foster</u>-<u>Fletcher Drain</u> that would actually come up into the Clearview Addition itself. That won't necessarily hold true for the people in the center or to the South. In the Center another regulated drain could be established for that 6 1/2 acres and that water could be carried out to the State highway and released there and travel to the North. To the South, it is the most difficult one of all because some of that water meanders and stands because it has alot of routes to get towards Sugar Creek. There would be alot of fall but, there would be a problem handling that because of cutting

through streets. The biggest concern that I have with that is the April 15, 1993 Meeting (Continued)

people will have to sacrifice trees and move some mini barns if a tile system was to be put in. We are not dealing with one wash, we are dealing with 3. Therefore, everyone is affected differently."

Bill Kirsher (Landowner) stated " I talked with 9 families there and we currently do not have a water problem on that side of the street. We have a 12 inch tile that runs from the second property on the North side that drains into that ditch. I know there are problems and I sympathize with these people. But, for at least these 9 families on that West side of the street, we would not like to be included. These 9 families put in a sanitary sewer on the West side of the street."

Landowner (?) asked " If the same type of sewer was put in over the whole area would that help surface drain and alleviate that problem quite a bit? The way I understood, the City was eventually going to come out there and do that in the next 3-5 years anyway."

Landowner (?) stated " I have lived in this addition for several years. We have never had a problem with water until this year.

Landowner (?) stated "I have lived at 2103 Lafayette Rd. right on the highway for 1 year, South of Hickory. I had my septic pumped out on March 7 because the smell was so bad I had to leave my home. Presently, I have a sump pump under the house but, it is out of order. There is water under my house, tons of water in my back yard. The water is backing up from septic tank. It will become a health problem if something is not done."

Paul Dickson stated "I don't know what the plans are from the City to annex that, but I'm sure that will probably happen within the next 2 years."

Alan Plunkett stated "You need to petition for some type of legal drain. Some people may have to sacrifice some space in order to put a tile in to get water out. This sub-division was developed before we had a drainage ordinance. The options I see, is to petition for a legal drain, clean up out front and put some new tile in to try to work this water away. Maybe petition the city to get help to alleviate some of the water on their septics, plus a drain. You're looking for this to take at least a year. We might be able to help you with pipes out front and ditching. Everybody will have to work together to get this done."

Landowner (?) "Maybe annexing will help."

Harvey Keller states " I spoke with the State Highway Department about their drainage and saw some of their plans. Yes,

they do have water that runs across towards the addition. We will April 15, 1993 Meeting (Continued)

have to see how the State wants to accept this, taking off the extra water load, plus what they can do as far as maybe redesigning some of their culverts. Down by Larry Cummings the pipes are too small and part os his lot stands in water. Some of that has to do with State Highway design."

Paul Dickson asks "Any suggestions as to what you want to do?"

Landowner (?) asks "Does the County have any responsibilities to us?"

Paul Dickson stated "You people would have to agree if they put side ditches in. Some may be unhappy with putting drain pipes under their driveways."

Larry Scott states "I'm sure it would help you and the Highway."

Landowner (?) "What size would be needed?"

Larry Scott stated "I'm unsure because of what elevation degrees it would be and what size the watersheds are. 12 inch pipe won't drain any more than 6 acres."

(?) "What size is the tile that's taking the water out now off of the ditch?"

(?) "15 inch starts. 15 and 18 inch ends."

Paul Dickson asks "Could you enlarge the tile of the <u>Fletcher</u> <u>Drain</u> and that would help?" Harvey Keller replies "yes."

Landowner (?) states " I live in the 10th house on the North side of Hickory and I have no movement of water."

Keller states "There is a strong difference in each individual lot. The natural terrain does take it toward ditch."

Paul Dickson suggests "In order to lower the surface water we would have to place a 16 inch pipe in your yard with at least 8 inches of cover. Which would result in at least a 24 inch ditch in your front yards."

Keller adds "There are other utility lines to think aboutseptic line, telephone lines. There would have to be alot of care taken not to cut into these lines. It will be a difficult operation to perform. Alot of study will be involved. I don't know how the City will respond to this because of annexation. There are drainage codes that have to be met with the County and the City as far as drainage goes."

April 15, 1993 Meeting (Continued)

Dave Russell (Landowner - Hickory Dr.) Stated: "There is an old tile that exists from my driveway tile, in excellent working order. I probably have as good storm drainage as anybody in front of the house. I still have side ditches that can be of better use to my neighbors to the North. I wouldn't have a problem with that as an option. Hooking up to the sanitary sewer is not the cure for everything.

Earl Kane (Landowner - 2402 Everett) has a lateral drain tile across front yard (6 inch plastic tile.) "In previous years on the West side of Everett they built up their land and closed off the previous drainage ditch and put in 8 inch plastic tile. On a heavy rain day you can see water flowing across the street into my front yard. My figure was to run the drain tile out to the highway and we did that ourselves in the early 70's. I still have a waterpocket in my back yard even though I have laterals to drain it."

Paul Dickson said "Your problems have all been multiplied through the years. A sewer would help your septic problems, if you could get on the city sewer.

Alan Plunkett stated "The first immediate thing we could do would be for the County Engineer, the County Surveyor and the County Highway Superintendent to go out and see what ditching we could do to help alleviate some of the surface water and work into some other things.

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Montgomery County Drainage Board Tuesday May 25, 1993

The Montgomery County Drainage Board met on May 25, 1993 in the Commissioners Office, Room 103, Courthouse, Crawfordsville, IN.

Those present were: P. Dickson, M. Kirtley, A. Plunkett; Commissioners, M. Spencer; Secretary, H. Keller; Surveyor, L. Utz; Chief Deputy, Chuck & Bob Watkins; Contractors, Alvin Winger; Landowner, Mr. Fugate; Landowner, John Yarian; Fugate Farms Manager, Patsy Cline; Press, Marian Lindow; League of Women Voters.

Chairman Dickson called the meeting to order at 9:12 a.m. <u>Phillip Dewey Ditch</u>: Reconstruction - Keller stated that the plans and prices are ready. All that's needed is a joint board meeting with Tippecanoe County. A letter has been sent to Mike Spencer. He is to respond.

Joseph Conway Ditch: Keller states that the project has been engineered. The plans are being drawn up by Dave Deckard. We should be able to go ahead this fall. Consists of 3.18 miles of open ditch.

<u>Joe Hall Ditch</u>: Maintenance - Keller stated that this fall we will have to dip out 2 - 3 miles and spray it. It's really out of hand on this open ditch.

<u>Basil VanCleave Ditch:</u> Keller says that E.B. Foster has completed over 500 feet of tile and the only thing left to do is smooth dirt down and reseed.

<u>Isaac Shotts, James Gilliand & Jessy Snoddy Ditches:</u> Keller stated that these ditches are 90-100 years old. Maintenance is a problem. There's nothing to hook up to. We need to replace 200-300 feet of tile. For these drains to be effective the Landowners will have to petition for reconstruction. There is no money for maintenance.

Jessy Snoddy Ditch: Regarding this ditch, the funds are gone. The job is not completed because of quicksand, Keller states. Dickson states that this is a good ditch for reconstruction. We need help with this one. The tile has been located where the waters going in, but we cannot locate where the tile coming out is. Because of quicksand we cannot locate the tile.

Keller states that ditches like this are beyond maintenance. The landowners will have to petition the courts or the Drainage Board for reconstruction.

<u>Isaac Shots Ditch:</u> Keller states, last fall we started out with 2 low spots on either side of the road. The tile to replace has been ordered and in the barn for Watkins to use to fix. The old tile is full and so is the 18 inch tile it dumps into. Downstream it runs well. There is a problem in the low areas. Another tile in side ditch was discovered and running well that we never knew existed before.

Utz states, Chuck has opened it up at the entrance to Mr. Winger's field and found the 12 inch we thought went through Mr. Fugate's land and someone has cut it off there and the 12 inch runs through the side ditch and is going into breather down there and cutting across and getting out. All the tile on Mr. Fugate's land is gone. So we came to the conclusion that the 12 inch across the

road is pretty flat, we thought we'd drop it down to 6 inch, bring it across the road and get some cover on it. It can also be done on the other side if the fall is there, but we will have to take some shots.

Chuck Watkins states, the fall is 7 inches in the wrong direction. Someone in the past went in to the side ditch and cut it off at Fugate's field and went around the wet spot and rehooked it. They also cut 12 inch lateral that's going across road and shut Mr. Winger off. So it has just been filling up with mud over the years.

Keller states, Where the old original tile runs, if this other 12 inch is bypassing that and hooks back in we will have to determine where this point is. Because the part that runs down to Mr. Fugate's is no good and it's running uphill. If we can get enough fall to run water to the 12 inch tile in the sideditch, we should propose to take over the 12 inch and abandon the old ditch that is useless. If we can't do this the only other alternative is we will have is to take all that land off the drain assessment list.

Mr. Fugate states, I would be willing to put laterals in, rather than be cut off and just not farm all that land.

Keller says, the whole area needs to be shot. There is no money available for reconstruction. There is some money in maintenance, but not enough. We will have to go the improvement fund.

Plunkett asks, what will laterals do if he only farms part of the land. How much fall is needed for laterals to work. Keller answers, No less than 1/10th per hundred feet. Plunkett asks, How long will this other stuff take? (shots, etc) Keller states, It will probably be done by tomorrow.

Fugate states, he would like for the county to install the laterals and get me back to using the county drain as I did before, the outlet is still in good shape.

Schmidt asks for any suggestions.

Keller states, we should hold public meetings on ditches like this and tell the landowners of the status of the ditches.

Keller is to take shots on the Shotts ditch.

<u>Wm. Buchanon:</u> Utz states, We have replaced 200 feet of 15 inch tile. The road had settled about 8 inches. Jones placed more gravel.

Keller: We have inspected drains for spraying, dipping, etc. 17 ditches will be up for bid this fall. 5 need to be dipped out.

Dickson asks for any suggestions on <u>Snoddy Ditch.</u> Keller says we should use the mouse. Alot of money has Keller says we should use the mouse. Alot of money has already been spent. We could not find the new tile. Dickson states, if the only alternative is the mouse, do it.

The meeting was called to order at 8:18 a.m.

Jessie Snoddy Ditch: Keller states, E.B. Foster has dug a 200 foot long trench. The ditch is boiling up in one spot because it is plugged. E.B. has dug a trench box and hauled in rock. The next step is to start digging in a couple of weeks when it is drier. Foster states, If the Board will agree to a delay, all that needs to be done now is to let it drain. Are there any objections? Dickson states, " I agree to this if no one else has any objections. (no objections.)

Keller states, regarding Wal-Mart, Larry Scott told me last week that the board has decided to wave this private project. Mr. Dye (landowner) still wants a letter of recommendation as to what size to use. Perhaps the Secretary should draw up a letter & have the Board sign it and send it to Mr. Dye if this is to be the case. Plunkett states, Don Schmidt should send this letter, not the secretary.

<u>Oak Hill & Clearview Subdivisions:</u> Keller states, The last two weeks we took shots and flagged the entire area. We found many, many isolated problems with individual drains and septic. Larry Scott will go ahead and plot it up for us.

<u>Albert Hysong Ditch:</u> Keller asks if we should send a registered letter as was discussed in a previous meeting? Scott states, I met with Walt Leader (Hendricks County Engineer) about three weeks ago. I am supposed to prepare a response from our Drainage Board. It will suggest that our Board should get a joint Board with Hendricks County and do a study as to what needs to be corrected. Their Board has indicated verbally that they will accept this in order to get this thing settled.

<u>Phillip Dewey Construction:</u> Keller states that Schmidt was to contact Tippecanoe County's Drainage Board to go over petitions and papers and create a Joint Drainage Board. Plunkett states, that the paper work is already in progress.

Joseph Conway Reconstruction: Consists of 3.2 miles of open ditch. Keller states, Dave Deckard will get me the preliminary plans by July 1. I have sent letters to IDNR and Army Corp of Engineers. I have not heard from IDNR. I have heard from the Corp and they said I am short a couple of items, but they don't see a problem with anything.

<u>Isaac Shotts:</u> We are having a problem with one of the tributarys states Keller. We decided we would replace about June 22, 1993 (continued)

400 feet of new tile. After going in and shooting it for fall we find out that one tile doesn't even work. Somebody came in on a private line and laid it up along the road, they cut right through our tile. We still want to cut through the road and put this tile in. Should we just make this a private tile or do we try to attempt to take over this 12 inch? This officially is a legal tributary. Somebody came in privately, illegally, and didn't notify the office of their intent. Dickson states, If these people have been assessed for a ditch assessment then they are entitled to something. Is there any money in that? Keller replies, Yes. Dickson states, If these people have been paying and they're not getting proper drainage, I can't see where we're going to be able to back off and not do anything with it. Plunkett states, You two (Keller & Scott) sit down and discuss this and report back to us and see what can be done without abandoning this ditch.

<u>Charles McFarland:</u> State Highway Engineer and Keller are working out a written agreement. The State will pay for boring & tile.

Stanford Elmore: Merritt discovered a hole where a 12 inch tile has been substituted.

Ditch spraying contract is being worked on now.

<u>Walter Schoen Tile:</u> Up for reconstruction this fall. Having trouble with erosion and breakdown.

<u>Basil VanCleave Ditch:</u> E.B. Foster has finished the job. Keller states, I have asked Larry Scott if I can borrow a backhoe from the County Highway to dig for cornerstones.

Scott states, regarding Whispering Acres (231S & 400), I have reviewed their preliminary plans regarding runoff. It complies with regulations. I recommend approval for preliminary plans.

Kirtley makes motion to approve, Plunkett seconds motion, Dickson makes it unanimous, motion carried.

The Montgomery County Drainage Board met on July 27, 1993 at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners Room, Courthouse, Crawfordsville.

Those present were: Harvey Keller, Surveyor; Larry Utz, Chief Deputy Surveyor; Melissa Spencer, Drainage Board Secretary; Paul Dickson, Chairman; Marion Kirtley, Board member; Alan Plunkett, Boardmember; Members of the Press; Larry Scott, Engineer; Dave Leaders, representing Chem-Trol. The meeting was called to order at 9:00a.m.

Bids for the calendar year of 1993 ditch spraying were opened. The first bid opened was from Chem-Trol of Gibsonburg Ohio. The second bid opened was from Lawn Rangers Corp. in Warsaw, Indiana. Dickson states the bids will be taken under advisement and discussed with attorney Don Schmidt, since he is not present. This motion was seconded by Kirtley and made unanimous by Plunkett's vote.

Keller states that the bidding is for per gallon applied. Both sides of the ditches. Adequate to kill 90% of the weeds. \$2.38 by Chem-Trol per gallon. Lawn Rangers bids \$2.10 per gallon.

<u>Clearview Subdivision & Oak Hill:</u> Keller states that topo shots were taken in May. L. Scott was to draw them up. Things are just coming together as to what the County can do. Oak Hill has three different ways to run water off. To the East, South & North. Clearview - we are still trying to figure out. Part of the water on North goes to the Foster Fletcher Drain. The bulk of the water goes under SR231 to the Ben Crabbs Drain. There were private drains cut along the road where Calsonic was put in. Larry Scott states this did not cause the problem. They were left open. There may be some problems because the surface water doesn't get off there in time. Plunkett states we should work on one at a time. Scott states that Clearview will be tougher. The sideditch is higher than some backyards that should drain into this.

<u>Gilliland Ditch:</u> Located at the airport. Keller states the tile is broken down. The tile is not the problem though, an aluminum weir structure is. It was put in by the city of Crawfordsville. Our tile will be taken out of the structure and ran around it this fall.

Keller states that it is full of willow <u>A&T Taylor Drain:</u> trees. SCS has been contacted and also some landowners. We would like to take over the waterway and split the first cost and clean this out. It will cause us more problems in the future because of no outlet. The landowner does not object.

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Joe Ludlow Ditch: Rd 700W near Wingate. Keller states this ditch runs under 700W. We are going to clean this out.

Wal-Mart & Mr. Dye - Keller states that Wal-Mart will put in a 24" tile across Mr. Dye's land. A letter of recommendation has been sent regarding what size of tile should be used and about using rip-rap. This matter is closed.

Hysong Drain: Larry Scott will prepare a response.

<u>P. Dewey Ditch:</u> Plans have been sent. They need a couple more items. 60 - 90 days will be needed.

<u>I. Shotts Ditch</u>: Southeast of Linden - Keller states there are two low areas. We will have to wait until the crops are out.

<u>J. Snoddy:</u> Held off because of water. We think the problem has been isolated. Work will continue when weather allows.

<u>C. McFarland</u>: Boring project under 32W - The State has been approached. It is best to do this while the road is closed due to the bridge repair.

<u>S. Elmore</u>: We will be replacing 1500' of tile and dip it out this fall.

Keller states that Indiana Gas has sent us a letter about a seminar being held August 18, 1993 regarding the location of gas lines. It was decided that this would be a good seminar to attend.

Those present were: Marion Kirtley, Paul Dickson, Alan Plunket: County Commissioners, Don Schmidt: Attorney, Harvey Keller: Surveyor, Missy Spencer: Secretary. The meeting was called to order at 8:53a.m.

An insurance policy was presented to Schmidt to read, it was then discussed. The policy was for E.B. Foster. He doesn't want any workmans comp and no employees. Schmidt states that he is not required by law to carry workmens comp, although we require it when they are using employees on one of our jobs. If he is caught with someone helping him on of our jobs, he must stop immediately and

the Board will meet with him.

Joseph Conway Ditch: S of Wingate - State Highway is to replace a bridge on 25. There is a petition to clean this drain. Dave Deckard was hired to engineer this ditch. <u>Charles McFarland Drain:</u> 3/4 mile E of the intersection 32 & 25- We are to work with the State Highway on this boring project under 25W. We have been waiting on the State. They will pay for anything in their right Of way. Engineer Bill Smith assured Keller we would have their plans by September 3. Now would be the time to do this while the road is closed. Harvey is to meet with them. The tile is small and needs to be put back on grade.

<u>Isaac Shotts Ditch:</u> Watkins is repairing this ditch on 100E. Good drainage has begun. Tile has been place and road repaired.

In other business: Schmidt asks the Larry Scott look at Ralph Corey's project as he is clearing a woods. Topos for Clearview have been drafted and given to Larry Scott. They may need a subsurface drain, not necessarily a legal drain. Plunkett suggest we may need a meeting with landowners if not annexed into the city.

Drainage Board Meeting Tuesday September 14, 1993

On Tuesday September 14, 1993 the Montgomery County Drainage Board met in the Montgomery County Court House, Commissioner's Room, Room 103.

Those present were Harvey Keller, Surveyor; Missy Spencer, Secretary; Paul Dickson, Chairman; Marion Kirtley and Alan Plunkett, Members.

The meeting was called to order at 9:35a.m.

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Keller presented a list of petitions for reconstruction. <u>Conway, Dewey & Walter Schoen</u> for this fall.

 $\underline{\textsc{Dewey:}}$ Attorneys of Tippecanoe and Montgomery have not gotten together.

<u>Conway:</u> Letters have been sent out to landowners about engineering costs. (35,000 acres by Wingate) It will cost around \$150,000, which will probably have to be borrowed from the bank. Keller met w/ Clinton County Surveyor about combining watersheds. One problem is that there are more than one drain in these watersheds. Clinton Co. has combined their watersheds.

<u>George Hutchinson:</u> The <u>Hudson & Humphreys</u> ditches feed into this ditch. This fall we would like to propose public meetings and ask landowners if the would like to combine. It will make tax time easier. Instead of getting two or three tax statements they will receive one. We will make the conversion over and money wise they won't be paying any more than they are now. Since these other ditches will become tributaries of the Hutchinson ditch we will still maintain them. It doesn't change anything except the tax statements. Keller showed a drawing of the ditch. Dickson states we should hold this meeting with the landowners on a Wednesday night.

Dickson states the <u>Hysong</u> ditch should be pushed ahead. We will receive a report from Larry Scott.

Dickson asks about the <u>Sanders</u> ditch. Keller states he has sent letters out to those people and asked them if they wanted to keep the petition alive. Out of about 30 or 40 letters sent out I received a response from about 5 people. Three people stated "yes" and two people said "no." I am going to push it again after the first of the year.

John McLaughlin Ditch: Mike Emmert who is a landowner on this ditch has asked for and been given permission by the Army Corp to straighten 1100 feet out. Tippecanoe County is giving him \$4,000 to help on a \$10,5000 project and he wanted to know if our County would consider doing anything like that. This request was given a

"no" answer.

The ditch spraying is done. Twenty drains were sprayed with Rodeo. We are already seeing results. Larry Utz accompanied them.

<u>Clearview Subdivision & Oak Hill:</u> Larry Scott is working on plans and specs for that.

Boring Project under 32 West. The state highway came and jetted this out. Not much junk was found. We did find out that one of the farmers had taken (in the concrete pipe) a piece of plastic tile and shoved it down in there to extend the height of the riser. In doing so they shoved it all the way down to the bottom of the tile and it is blocking the tile. We had to remove the entire thing to find this out. The tile is running uphill. Keller went to the St. Highway and they gave him a manual about all the does and dont's. The St. Highway will pay for everything that's done on their property. We will pay for anything that's outside of their right -of-way, like the hook up of the tile. This will be about a \$12,0000 job.

Keller states we have relocated and monumented 22 section corner stones. We have found some new ones.

Keller told of letter he sent out to 25 surveyors in Indiana to have an informal meeting to discuss some common problems and achievements. No location or date have been set. Hamilton & Bartholomew county surveyors are also involved in this.

Meetings from previous meetings were left to be signed.

The meeting was called to order at 11:19 A.M.. Keller reported on the <u>Dewey Ditch & Conway Ditch</u> - We have received approval from the Army Corp, but not from the DNR or IDEM as of yet. They have received the information they need though.

Keller also told of a meeting being held on November 3, 1993 for all area County Surveyors in Noblesville. They will be discussing some problems they might face and any suggestions that someone attending might have.

Keller also reminded the Board of a night meeting to be held on November 10th at 7:00 and 7:45 PM to discuss the combining of watersheds. The first watershed to be discussed at 7:00 will be the <u>Schenck-Little Drains</u> and the second meeting at 7:45 is to discuss the <u>Fleming-Liter Drains</u>.

Regarding the <u>McFarland</u> project - The State Highway and the County Surveyor are about ready for the boring project to begin.

Keller also asks that we be notified when money for ditches are paid out for reconstruction projects or collected so that are books may be kept up to date.

Keller states that we have gotten proposal quotes for a new vehicle for the Surveyor. We are expecting some more so we will hopefully be able to formally address this at the next meeting.

<u>Snoddy Ditch-</u> There has been no work done here since July, 1993 due to wet weather. Dewey Lang (landowner) requests a culvert to correct flooding. He has been a landowner for 10 years. He is against the fixing of the <u>Snoddy Ditch</u>. He has an area that is constantly wet. The road floods also. (This ditch was constructed in 1915. 254 acres drain in) He states that we do not need a ditch this deep. Perhaps the County Highway should be responsible for flooding. They should put in a culvert. Dickson states that in the past it was suggested to raise the road. What suggestions do you have Harvey? Keller suggests that we finish the repair job and hold a meeting to compare options and go from there. He also states that the bad tile has not been reached yet because of wet weather in the past. At 7:15p.m. Commissioner Dickson called the meeting to order. Harvey Keller reported on the meeting that he attented in Indianapolis with the D.N.R. and I.D.E.M. regarding county agencies versus federal agencies. He also reported on an informal meeting in Noblesville he attended with several other county surveyors. Another meeting is planned prior to March of 1994.

Schenck Ditch: The history of the ditch was given by Keller. The ditch was constructed in 1895 and reconstructed in 1919. It drains 1,203 acres including the <u>Guy Little Ditch</u>. Tile size varies - 15" to 24" into an open ditch. Keller then presented a map of the ditches. At this time the Little drain has a seperate assessment. Keller asked for the feelings of the landowners as far as combining these watersheds and making one tax assessment. He then stated that Mr.McCormick had expressed his desire to leave everything as is prior to the meeting. At this time Mr. McCormick said his assessment has gone up. He also presented pictures of his land after 1 1/2 inches of rain. He looses land production. He has lived here for 23 years and says this ditch has never been completely open.

Drainage Board Meeting November 10, 1993 (Continued)

Keller suggests thatperhaps Soil conservation should step in regarding waterway reshaping and asks Mr. McCormick if he would be opposed to rerouting the ditch. McCormick states that the ditch has only been dry 2 times in 23 years and it cuts his farm to pieces. He would like the ditch opened up from the headwall to the <u>Schenck</u> Ditch. It worked good after having been previously opened up.

Keller then reported on the Annual Assessment. The <u>Schenck</u> <u>Ditch</u> has an assessment of \$1500/year or \$6000 over 4 years. It now has a balance of \$1510. Keller suggests that perhaps we should extend the tile line of the <u>Guy Little</u> beyond the headwall up into the tributary and make it part of the <u>Little Ditch</u>. According to records, at the present time the <u>Little Ditch</u> stops at the headwall. Ken Snyder (landowner for 1 year) suggests that the end of the <u>Little Ditch</u> should be where the drains combine, not at the headwall. Keller states that this would change the watershed, but not much.

Paul Dickson then asks for landowners suggestions. Mr. McCormick states that the first thing that needs to be done is to get the ditch working properly from the headwall. Then tile it if the money is available or open it clear up. 500 feet would be tile and 800 feet would be cleaned out. Keller states that perhaps we should keep the ditches as they are at the present but, change the drain start and finish points and clean it out and repair it. Snyders asks if this would chang his assessment. Keller suggests that more than likely not, perhaps even a decrease. McCormick states that he has contacted Dave Rush and Ken Hudson (landowners) and they wish to leave thing as is.

Commissioner Plunkett makes a motion to leave everything the way it is at the present time. Kirtley secons the motion and Dickson makes it unanimous. Keller is to give notice to the affected landowners the the <u>Guy Little Ditch</u> is to be kept seperate from the <u>Schenck</u> and the watershed will not be combined.

James Fleming Drain & Martin Liter Drain:

Keller gives a history of these drains. The <u>Fleming</u> is a legal drain and the <u>Liter</u> used to be a legal drain. The <u>Fleming</u> was constructed in 1905. Keller then presented a map and explained where the two ditches meet. We would like to combine these ditches and make one watershed and one assessment. He then asked for landowners feelings on the subject.

Jeff Myers states that they would go along with it but the <u>Fleming</u> needs to be opened up at the railroad. Keller states he has contacted the railroad and they have not responded. The State Highway has also been contacted and say they will take a look at it. The northern most pipe is full. Myers states he has lost crops. Keller suggests we have three options:

- 1. The <u>Liter</u> has it's own maintenance, landownerw will be paying on the <u>Fleming</u> also.
- 2. Or, combine the ditches and receive one tax assessment.
- 3. Keep everything as is.

Myers suggests that the <u>Liter</u> needs to be cleaned out. Keller says in order to do this there will have to be a petition and the landowners will have to agree since this is no longer a legal drain. Mr. Stwalley asks if we are asking to take over this ditch and make it a legal county drain. Keller replies yes, but this is up the landowners. The water drains into the <u>Fleming</u>. This could be put on a per use basis. Most people are opposed to paying as we have found in the past. Myers agrees, the people on a ditch should be paying only on a ditch used. Leave the <u>Fleming</u> people out of it. Mr. Stwalley also agrees. Mr. DeVore suggest the <u>Liter Ditch</u> should be cleaned out and then we could discuss combining the two into one watershed. Schmidt states that the <u>Liter</u> could be petitioned and set up as a seperated legal drain. Mr. Devore makes a motion to leave everything as is. Commissioner Dickson suggests that the landowners petition to make the <u>Liter Drain</u> a legal ditch.

Plunkett makes a motion to leave things as is and not combine the watershed at this time. Kirtley seconds the motion and Dickson makes it unanimous.

Jesse Snoddy Ditch:

Keller presented a history of the drain. There is 500 feet of open ditch, the tributary is 2,200 feet long. It has an annual assessment of \$1250/ year. At the present time this ditch is in the red over \$3000. There was a tile breakdown reported earlier in the year. A contractor was sent in to locate the problem. The tile is 10 feet deep at the bad spot. It contains quicksand and blow holes. There is not much drainage at the outlet. This meeting tonight is to decide what to do with this drain. \$8000 has been spent this year. The road is always flooded over. In 1970 a been spent this year. The road is always flooded over. large metal sewer pipe was placed in a field and it started to Keller states that only one sewer under the South end of drain. the Nort/South road out of Alamo. Dewey Lang suggest a culvert be placed under the East/West road. Larry Scott states that on the East side of CR825W there is a 10 inch beehive South of CR300S. It is 10 inches in diameter and there was water flowing there today. There is a manhole on the North side of CR300S close to the "T" road, here there is a valve to shut off and allow drainage from South to West. Keller states the trouble spot has been located.

Dewey Lang asks if this could be repaired and how much more money would be needed to fix this. Larry Scott suggest that placing the tile as Mr. Lang previously suggested would flood the County highway.

Mr. Lang suggests that they use Cecil Dunlap's property as a detention pond. Scott states he feels that this was originally laid out thinking sub-surface drains would work. Keller then presented a map of the are that also showed past tile holes. He suggests that the assessment would not increase but will be paid over a longer period of time. Some field work will need to be done. Paul Dickson ask for any suggestions the landowners might have. Mr. Rush asks what the plans are. Keller asks if a whole new system would be beneficial? Dewey Lang says at the present it is to deep to drain any of my fields. Keller states the entire thing would have to be engineered - shots, dye, etc.. Dewey Lang agrees. Mr. Rush asks what about building a waterway. Keller says that the Soil Conservation would have to be contacted regarding that matter. The real problem here is the surface water

- nothing is adequate. I can contact the Soil Conservation for you and they will have to work with us regarding a waterway.

Mr. Rush suggest that the tile holes that are already ther need to be fixed first and cost efficiently. Keller agrees. Rick Lang suggest a Civil Engineer be brought in. Will the County pay for this? Dewey Lang asks how long his assessment will stay the same. Keller states that hopefully until the ditch is out of the red. Money is being taken from the Improvement Fund. Schmidt states the assessment will continue at the same rate. For a larger increase in Maintenance it will take an okay from landowners and by acreage. Rick Lang states that in the past the Maintenance has been raised.

Plunkett requests that Keller contact Soil Conservation. Dewey Lang asks what about the hole that's already there. Keller suggests that will probably have to be fixed. Keller also states that maintenance would have to be petitions. Ten percent of acreage needed to hold a hearing and 51% of the acreage to pass.

The Montgomery County Drainage Board met on Tuesday, January 4, 1994 in the Commissioners Room of the Courthouse. Those present were as follows: Commissioners: Kirtley, Dickson and Plunkett; Drainage Board Attorney, Don Schmidt; County Surveyor, Harvey Keller; Highway Engineer, Larry Scott; 1st Deputy, Larry Utz; Highway Super., Homer Cox; Dr. Board Secretary, Missy Spencer; and members of the press.

The meeting was called to order at 9:15 a.m. Keller gave an update on both the <u>Phillip Dewey Ditch</u> & the <u>Joseph Conway Ditch</u>. In. Dept of Environmental Mgmt. toured both ditches along with Keller, Utz, Dave Deckard, and two landowners on the <u>Dewey</u> ditch. IDEM wishes for one side of these ditches to be left as is, other than some minor things (clearing of brush, etc.) that can be done. All big trees must stay. Keller states he also spoke with Pat Rucker of Army Corp of Engineers. She stated that all is okay on the Dewey Ditch project. Therefore a joint board with Tippecanoe County needs to be formed. Tippecanoe Co. Drainage Board meets tomorrow and they will discuss this issue also. It was decided in a previous meeting that Mr. Hershel Disney will be the outside member that needs to be present.

Regarding the <u>Conway Ditch</u>, Keller has received a letter from the Corps. They are waiting for more information from Dave Deckard. This info needs to be received by them within 30 days or we will have to refile and start from square one again.

<u>Schenck Ditch:</u> Keller states that the SCS is going to cost share for a water way in George McCormicks pasture. We may have to place tile in the open ditch. We may do this and reseed the area and SCS will build the waterway.

William McClamroch Ditch: Keller and SCS went to look at this area yesterday. Keller also received a letter from Steve Woll of the SCS. A 37 1/2 acre tract has been purchased and they wish to make a subdivision know as Parker Place here. Mr. Dale Crum, a landowner on this ditch will receive alot of water if this project continues as is. Keller states that the owners of Parker Place cannot tie into a legal drain without permission from the Board. He feels at the present time that there are two many lots being planned. The present waterway will not suffice. SCS suggests that the Parker Place landowners build their own tile and parallel our drain and outlet into an open ditch. Larry Scott states that Parker Place has just recently been reviewed and passed as far as the Drainage Ordinance was concerned. However, if they have more lots planned than they were approved for they may not meet the Drainage Ordinance. They may need to reapply. Scott suggests that Mr. Crum and Steve Woll are both unaware of our Drainage Ordinance. He suggests he will visit Parker Place and then arrange a meeting with the parties concerned.

Keller asks Scott for an update on the <u>Clearview</u> and <u>Oak Hill</u> projects. Scott states that he will have recommendations on both these jobs at the next regular meeting in two weeks.

<u>McLaughlin Drain</u>: Mike Emmert, a landowner has received permission from SCS to straighten out the ditch on his property. One of our outlets is under water due to and headwall that needs to be reconstructed and a beaver dam that needs to be removed. (Keller presented pictures of drain) Tippecanoe County is going to help with the cost of the project for Mr. Emmert. Keller states he doesn't see where any money we could provide to help with the cost would benefit our county. He suggests we remove the beaver damn, since there is no congestion and the water is getting away okay. writing. About 30 days has now passed." Paul Dickson - Then these two drains are just sitting in limbo? Keller - Yes. The Dewey has been ready to go for a long time. I just can't seem to get that joint board going. Now on the <u>JOSEPH</u> <u>CONWAY</u> ditch, I'm waiting on the engineer, Dave Deckard, to forward his plans to me. Mr. Deckard has a problem: his bill was over \$13,000.00, for which he has been paid \$7,000.00.

Dickson - I don't see a problem. We have a contract that says \$7,000 - and not over 5.5 per-cent of the construction cost, and he has received \$7,000 and I think he's got all he is going to get. This was done without the authority of the Drainage Board. We never authorized him to do that. Where is the money coming from for all of this?

Keller - He was paid out of the general drain improvement fund which the people on the ditch are being charged as a separate assessment for the engineering fee to be paid over the next two years starting this year - and the improvement fund will be repaid from this payment.

<u>KENNETH HUDSON DRAIN:</u> Keller: Prior to 1952, this drain had an annual maintenance assessment of \$100.00 IN 1982, at a public hearing, it was raised to \$1000.00. On 10-1-90, it was raised to \$2000.00. But it never was put on the new assessment roll but has remained at \$1000.00 per year. In 1992, we spent about \$4000 repairing this drain, digging up a street in Elmdale to replace and repair the tile. We water-jetted it; placed the road back; cut down trees - and the county highway came out and dug out the side ditches (at no cost to the drain) for surface water run off.

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Drainage Board Meeting February 1, 1994 (Continued)

Currently the fund has \$324.00, but we are in the red \$1906.00. I wrote all the landowners to remind them that the assessment had been raised at the 1990 ditch hearing to \$2000, even though it had never been raised to that. One landowner, Earl Smith, who owns enough land to control 50% of the drain, did not want to see it raised because the ditch is working better now than it has in years.

Dickson - Were the landowners aware of the assessment raise? Keller - Sure! We held the meeting and it was raised. We had the hearing on October 1, 1990.

Dickson - What happened to the assessment?

Keller - I suppose it was just one of those things that happened - it just didn't get put on. We've had so many ditch hearings in the last 3-4 years....

Dickson - Who has the authority to put it on? Your Office?

Keller - We bring over the ditch changes to the Auditor's office and the changes are recorded there. Pat Kincaid should have a record of this.

Nelda Hester - The \$2000 assessment? You brought it over here? Keller - Yes. But that was in 1990. Evidently it may have been overlooked. Now there is the possibility that we don't need the assessment to be \$2000.

Dickson - That ditch is in good repair now except for the \$1900 it is in the hole, right?

Keller - Yes. As a matter of fact, Earl Smith came in about a week ago and said it was in the best condition it has been in years, so it shouldn't be raised. The whole reason to raise it was to take care of the problems it was facing. The problems have been solved but we are in the red for it. Left at \$1000 per year, it will take two years to pay back the improvement fund from the annual assessment.

Nelda Hester and Pat Kincaid pulled the ditch file and the only Hudson assessment roll Pat had was for the \$1000 roll. Keller examined it and said it was the wrong assessment roll.

Dickson -Do we still need it to be \$2000?

Keller - It is in the drainage board minutes. It was voted on and raised on 10-1-90.

Hester -What do you want to do now? Keller - I think we can get by on the \$1000 per year assessment even being in the hole with that money repaying the general drain improvement fund. But that couldn't be done without a hearing. Should we hold another hearing? We are looking at a March 1st deadline.

Drainage Board Meeting February 1, 1994 (Continued)

Plunkett - What does the Drainage Law state? Keller - I've never come across this problem before. I will have to double check that for you and get back with you as soon as possible.

Dickson - Okay. Is there anything else? Keller - That's all I have gentlemen.

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Montgomery County Drainage Board Tuesday March 15, 1994

The Montgomery County Drainage Board met on Tuesday, March 15, 1994 at 8:08 a.m., in the Commissioners Room of the Montgomery County Courthouse. Those present were: Paul Dickson, Chairman; Marion Kirtley, Vice Chairman; Alan Plunkett, Member; Harvey Keller, Surveyor; Larry Utz, Chief Deputy; Don Schmidt, Attorney; Missy Spencer, Secretary and Curt Hudson, Landowner on the John Gobin Ditch. The meeting was called to order at 8:08 a.m.

It was reported that Curt Hudson is a landowner on the <u>Gobin</u> <u>Ditch</u>. He owns land on the south side of road across from the Heinold Hog Farm, Just south of CR 900N and east of US 231. He wishes to be able to farm this land. The existing tile is part clay and part plastic. It has floated and is off grade. Also it has three broken tile areas. The land is low and drainage is difficult. The tile was previously replaced around the time the State rebuilt the Linden overpass area. The annual maintenance on this drain is \$3,000 per year. The current balance is \$1,534. This ditch owes the General Drain Improvement Fund \$234.61. Mr. Hudson proposes that he will pay for the project in advance, then be reimbursed through the maintenance fund at a later date. Harvey states that the estimated cost of this project would be somewhere around \$2,600.00.

Chairman Dickson stated that he had already spoken with Mr. Hudson previous to this meeting and told Mr. Hudson that all we can do is check it out and see if we can legally do this and if it's even feasible if it is legal. Attorney Don Schmidt stated that the Board cannot allow Mr. Hudson to do this and be repayed that, but they could borrow the money and repair it. Plunkett makes a motion that we fix it after the money is borrowed. Kirtley seconds the motion and Dickson makes it unanimous. Harvey is to receive proposals from at least three contractors and present the findings to the Board. He thought he could do so by the end of the week.

Keller states that Mr. Hudson has also made a proposal asking to hook into two tiles on the <u>Isaac Shotts</u> Drain. Keller read a letter that he sent to Mr. Hudson giving him permission to hook in. This will be an improvement in draining the water. The estimated acreage involved is 30-40 acres, more or less. Mr. Hudson was reminded that he will have to acquire permission from all landowners and also inform the Surveyor's Office of the dates of installation in the letter. Kirtley makes a motion to accept Keller's decision. Plunkett seconds the motion and Dickson makes it unanimous.

Richard Thomas Ditch: Larry Utz went out on a tile hole call. He reports that Wey(Contractor Jack Jones & himself) opened 4 spots recently and the tile kept crumbling. It needs to be repaired from the headwall North 400 feet. (20 inch tile) This ditch has an annual assessment of \$1000. It has a current balance of \$1,959.00. The estimated cost for this project is approximately \$4,634 minus the \$1,959 left in maintenance, leaves a balance of \$2,675 to borrow. Keller states that we will see the Council next month and ask for the money. The new tile will be placed directly where the old tile was in order to keep the flow moving well. We will draw up a legal proposal. Don Miles, a landowner, will be in to discuss this at a later date.

Keller stated there will be no fall ditch spraying this year or any major maintenance projects, except on ditches that need the work and have the funds to do so. Mulching was then discussed. It seems to be working well as long as it is done while plants are still green.

Keller states that he met with the State Highway yesterday regarding the <u>McFarland Ditch</u>. Two bid packets have been sold and the plans were approved by the State. He also reminded the Board of the Joint Board meeting with Tippecanoe County on March 29th at 1:00 p.m. at the Montgomery County Courthouse.

Keller reports that every open ditch has been inspected recently and he will present his findings to the Board at a later date, first in the form of a letter.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:32 a.m.

The Montgomery County Drainage Board met on Tuesday, April 26, 1994, in the Commissioners Room of the Montgomery County Courthouse. Those present were: Paul Dickson, Chairman; Alan Plunkett, Member; Harvey Keller, Co. Surveyor; Missy Spencer, Drainage Board Secretary; Les Ingersoll, Co. Councilman; Don Schmidt, Drainage Board Attorney; Nelda Hester, County Auditor and members of the press.

Chairman Dickson called the meeting to order at 8:12am. Keller reported that he has met with Earl Hornbeck regarding the <u>Chs. McFarland Ditch.</u> They have taken some field shots and looked the area over. Mr. Hornbeck will certify the plans and re-submit them. Keller reports that the two companies that have already bid on this project are concerned about their checks they turned in with their bids. Should they be sent back? Don Schmidt asks if the job will have to be re-bid? Keller replies that he thinks it will. He also reports that the State says as long as the cost doesn't go over the amount of money that they are putting up for the project, they don't care whether it's re-bid or not.

Plunkett makes the motion that these previous bids be rejected due to a change in plans. Dickson seconds the motion and makes it unanimous. New plans will be available and the job will be re-bid.

Keller reports that six ditches that need to be fixed this spring cannot be repaired due to the fact that these individual ditch funds are in the red. Nelda Hester has been in contact with the State Board of Accounts and we cannot borrow money from the General Maintenance Fund and put the money in the Improvement Fund. Schmidt informs the Board that money in the Maintenance Fund can be borrowed from one ditch and loaned to another as long as its paid back. Nelda reports that there is \$257,000 in the Maintenance Fund. She will talk with the State Board of Accounts and report what she finds regarding borrowing money from one Drain for another, within the Maintenance Fund. Keller reports that one of the ditches in the red is the <u>Allen Lewis Ditch.</u> Due to some bills being turned in on this drain with the April 1994 claims, what are we to do? Schmidt suggests that we wait and hear from the State Board of Accounts. If they will allow borrowing money within the Maintenance Fund, he recommends that the Drainage Board approve this.

Plunkett asks about the Basil VanCleave Drain. Has this job been completed and filled in? Keller reports that the project has not been completed. A landowner on the lower end has received the dirt that was needed to fill it in. Plunkett states that this dirt was not spread out. Was it in the contract to do so? Keller is unsure and reports that he will review the contract to refresh his

memory on the specifics. The contractor (E.B. Foster) has been paid a partial payment for the services already rendered. Final payment will be made after the entire job is completed.

Keller and Schmidt discussed the County Drainage Ordinance. Keller reports that the Ordinance does not include a sub-section that states that the developer should keep and maintain all existing tile drains for drainage and the water trouble for SCS. Schmidt informs Keller that the Ordinance only covers surface water and not sub-surface water. The way to take care of sub-surface water would be through a legal county drain being established. This subject will be further discussed at a future meeting.

Dickson reports that the Commissioners have each received letters from the Soil Conservation Service regarding Curt Hudson. The letter stated that this area has been designated as a wetland.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned. Time 8:36 a.m.

The Montgomery/Tippecanoe Joint Drainage Board met in the Montgomery County Courthouse in the Commissioner's Office on July 25, 1994. Those present were as follows: Paul Dickson, Chairman; Nola Gentry, Boardmember; Bill Hahn, Boardmember; Marion Kirtley, Boardmember; Herschel Gentry, Boardmember; Harvey Keller, Montgomery Co. Surveyor; Mike Spencer, Tippecanoe Co. Surveyor, Melissa Spencer, Drainage Board Secretary; Don Schmidt, Drainage Board Attorney; Floyd Burroughs and John Darow of Floyd Burroughs and Assoc., Engineering Co.

Chairman Dickson called the meeting to order at 11:08 A.M. Keller read the minutes of a previous joint meeting held on March 29, 1994. Keller reports that he received 7 remonstrances from landowners that were against the <u>Philip Dewey</u> reconstruction project. Some of these landowners would be for the project if the project was extended further north into Tippecanoe county. Keller reports that we haven't officially hired an engineering firm. He recommends that the board take into consideration the hiring of Floyd Buroughs and Assoc. to do this.

Mike Spencer reports that some of his landowners were not notified prior to our previously scheduled July 5, 1994 meeting. Alot of his landowners would also like to see the project extended further, clear up to Wea Creek. This project would include 4 open drains in Montgomery Co. and 3 open drains in Tippecanoe County. Keller asks, if we were to extend the project, would we have to repetition? The overall feeling is yes. The attorney should be asked. (He has previously left the meeting.) Keller reports that he has received approval from DNR, SCS and possible approval from IDEM over the phone (they are to send fax) regarding the original plans of the project. Bill Hahn suggests that the extension should be looked at. Nola Gentry suggests that the cost should be looked at also.

Dickson asks the Board their feelings regarding the extension to include Wea Creek. All present agree this should be considered. Therefore, a new petition should be prepared. Mr. Keller and Mr. Spencer will do this jointly, very soon. Attorney Schmidt (he has since returned) suggests that new petitions be prepared before the Board considers hiring Floyd Buroughs & Assoc., since we may not even need an engineering firm. Keller asks if this means that Floyd Buroughs & Assoc. are being put on hold? The boards reply is

yes. Petitions should be drawn up and then the board will proceed from there. These petitions should include reconstruction and maintenance. The leg work for this project will include additional signatures on the petitions. There being no further business the meeting was adjourned. Time - 12:05 P.M.

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Montgomery County Drainage Board August 30, 1994

The Montgomery County Drainage Board met on Tuesday August 30, 1994 in the Commissioner's room of the Montgomery County Courthouse. Those present were as follows: Paul Dickson, Chairman; Marion Kirtley, Vice-Chairman; Alan Plunkett, Member; Missy Spencer, Secretary; Larry Utz, Chief Deputy Surveyor; Larry Scott, County Engineer; Homer Cox, Highway Superintendent; Mr. & Mrs. George Inskeep, Landowner on the Allen Lewis Drain; and Mr. Simmons, Concerned with the building project located on Grace Ave. in the City of Crawfordsville.

The meeting was called to order at 9:51 a.m. Chairman Dickson stated that the board had received a letter of resignation from Harvey Keller. The resignation goes into effect on August 26, 1994. Since Larry Utz is the Chief Deputy, he has been appointed to serve as County Surveyor until such a time that someone else is appointed to the position.

Mr. Simmons presented photos and expressed his disgust with a building project in progress on Grace Ave. in Crawfordsville. The construction itself is a city problem. The control of the surface water is under the county authority. Mr. Simmons is asking that a deadline be set for the builder, in which must time he must comply with a stormwater drainage recommendation. Dickson asks if all the recommendations for storm water has been followed. Larry Scott states that a final ok on the storm water plan has not been given. He also states that the City of Crawfordsville is not to issue any more building permits for this area at this time. Two double units have been built and they are working on a third and fourth one at this time. Dickson asks Scott to contact the city regarding this project and also check the site. Mr. Simmons wishes for the water to be retained. Larry Scott explained the photos and explained the Since the project has not been completed, flow of the water. Dickson asks that Mr. Simmons wait and give Larry Scott a chance to check the site out and report on his findings.

Larry Utz presented a bill from George Inskeep on the <u>Allen</u> <u>Lewis Drain</u>. Before planting season of this year some tile holes were repaired until the ditch ran out of money. Mr. Inskeep had Jack Jones come in and replace 100' of tile since then. The bill presented was for the work performed by Jones for \$2,052.73. Inskeeps have spent \$26,000 on their drain and feel the money was wasted because the county ditch isn't draining properly. Inskeep reports that Harvey Keller told him they would be reimbursed. Utz reads notes left by Keller regarding this matter. The note stated that " a bill had been submitted by George Inskeep for work performed by Jack Jones. Mr. Inskeep volunteered to pay for this work as the county fund has ran into the red. He wants reimbursed.

The Drainage Board must decide. No promises or guarantees by the Surveyor's Office." At this time this drain is \$487.27 in the red. Plunkett discusses the current ditch assessments. This ditch and others are running with assessments from the 1920's and we are paying 1990's prices. There are approximately 30 ditches in the red at this time and need to be raised at least 25% over the next few years. These ditches will have to be brought back into the black or the landowners will have to take over the ditches. We cannot use maintenance funds to reconstruct. Dickson asks that the bill be left with the Drainage Board and it will be discussed with the County Attorney.

Dick Hunsicker, a landowner on the Lye Creek Drain, has a sewer tile that is rusted out and is letting the bank fall in. The catch basin is also rusted out. A 12 inch tile is blowing up back into the field. Hunsicker fixed one hole this last spring. The catch basin may be a SCS problem. Utz will contact SCS and see if it's the county's responsibility or SCS's. There is some money in the account for Lye Creek. The approximate cost will be \$3,000 to put a corrugated medal pipe in, 30' back.

The plans for the <u>Charles McFarland</u> ditch project have been certified and Utz will pick them up this afternoon.

Mike Emmert has cleaned out part of the McLaughlin Drain (not a legal county drain). Tippecanoe County has given Emmert money to help with that project and Emmert is asking our county to help also since he feels it will benefit the Allie Peterson drain. There is \$5,087 in the Peterson fund. Emmert has a bill for \$15,830. Utz will go out and take a look at the area and report back to the Board.

<u>Phillip Dewey Ditch</u> - Utz reports that petitions have been reissued and should be signed and returned soon.

Utz presented three contracts from E.B. Foster that he had received from Harvey Keller. One was for mulching brush on the <u>Jennings-Miller Drain</u> for \$3,190 for 2800'. On the <u>Linn-Himes</u> <u>Drain</u> it was for 2,200' at a cost of \$2,420. The third was regarding the <u>Epperson Drain</u> close to Nucor. Where an old abandoned bridge has fallen in, Keller asked Foster to move the concrete and put it on existing banks. This could be done at a cost of \$1,500. There is enough money in all three funds to cover the expense. The abandoned bridge may be private property now and not that of the countys. Perhaps it has been vacated. The Board

asks that Foster be held off on this project until Don Schmidt can take a look at where the County stands. Plunkett makes a motion that the cleaning of the <u>Jennings-Miller Drain</u> and the <u>Linn-Himes</u> <u>Drain</u> be approved. Kirtley seconds the motion. Dickson makes the motion unanimous.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned. Time 10:41 A.M.

The Montgomery County Drainage Board met in the Commissioners Room of the Montgomery County Courthouse on Tuesday September 27, 1994. Chairman Dickson called the meeting to order at 10:15 A.M. The first order of business was George Inskeep concerning the <u>Allen</u> <u>Lewis Drain</u>. Mr. Inskeep had turned in a bill at the previous meeting asking for reimbursement on some work he had performed on the drain. The bill was for \$2,000. Utz states that the ditch is in the red \$387.27 at this time. The annual assessment on this ditch is \$961 per year. Schmidt suggests there are two choices in which Mr. Inskeep can be reimbursed if the board wishes to do so. We can approach the Council about borrowing the money and then paying the County General Fund back or perhaps we could pay Mr. Inskeep so much a year until it is fully paid. Dickson states that in the past it has not been the Boards policy to reimburse for these services but, the Board will agree to \$500 per year for the next four years if Mr. Inskeep will agree to this. Mr. Inskeep will accept this agreement.

Mike Emmert, landowner on the McLaughlin Ditch, was present asking for financial assistance on some work that was previously performed on his property. Tippecanoe County reimbursed Mike part of the cost since it benefitted the Martin P. Gray Ditch. Since he also feels it will benefit our Allie Peterson Ditch, Montgomery County should help. Utz states that he has inspected this ditch and feels that the Peterson Drain will benefit from Mike cleaning The Coyner Ditch will also benefit. the drain out. Plunkett states that the county can only spend money on a legal county drain and the McLaughlin is not a legal county drain. Schmidt suggests that perhaps a petition should be circulated for reconstruction. It was also suggested that reconstruction only be done in Montgomery County if necessary. Schmidt also suggests that a meeting be held with Tippecanoe County Surveyor in regards to reconstruction.

Joseph Conway Drain - A petition was carried and turned into the Surveyor approximately three years ago to reconstruct this drain. The Drainage Board has not seen this petition until todays meeting. A date of November 9, 1994 at 7:00 P.M. was set regarding this ditch. ***

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Lye Creek Drain - Utz asked about a proposal that was turned in at the previous meeting from Jack Jones. It was given to Larry Scott and he has not had a chance to take a look at it. Schmidt asks for this to be brought up at the next meeting.

<u>Wm. Epperson Drain</u> - Utz read minutes from prior drainage board meetings. Plunkett makes the motion that E.B. Foster be allowed to clean up the drain and do the work under Utz's supervision. Kirtley seconds the motion and it is made unanimous by Plunkett.

<u>Chs. McFarland Drain</u> - The project has been certified and the contracts signed. A notice to bidders should be sent out.

Jesse Snoddy Ditch - This ditch is \$2,488.69 in the red regarding the maintenance fund. It also owes the improvement fund. Plunkett states this ditch should be raised 25% as soon as possible by recommendation of the State Board of Accounts. This will have to be done before any work can be done.

<u>Yater Addition</u> - Located in Darlington. Phase 1 has been platted. Larry Scott recommends that the Board approve. Kirtley makes motion to approve, Plunkett seconds and made unanimous by Dickson.

Chairman Dickson called the meeting to order at 9:45 A.M. The first order of business was concerning Mike Emmert on the <u>McLaughlin Drain</u>. Emmert is asking for financial assistance for work he has done on the McLaughlin Drain. There is no maintenance on the McLaughlin at this time. There is a maintenance fund set up on the <u>Peterson Drain</u> and the <u>Coyner Drain</u> and they are benefitting from Emmert's work. The total bill for Emmert's work is \$10,400. Tippecanoe County reimbursed Emmert \$4,000 due to the work benefitting one of their drains. Leaving a balance of \$5,400. Plunkett makes a motion to allow \$3,200 in reimbursement to be divided between the Peterson and Coyner Drains as Utz sees fit, as far as which ditch will benefit more.
