
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

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MONTGOMERY COUNTY DRAINAGE BOARD January 17, 1983 1:45 PM

The Montgomery County Drainage Board met Monday, January 17, 1983 at 1:45 PM in the Auditors Office. Those present were Chairman, Don Maxwell; Vice-Chairman, Sam Boots; Attorney, Warren McGaughey; Auditor, Mary Helen Carter; Surveyor, Russ Nelson; Landowners on Moses Maxwell Drain; John Booher and Max Fletcher; Robert Dellinger and Russ Abbott of the Moores Heights Drain; Engineer, Robert Hill and Contractor, Kevin Miller regarding Joseph Hall Drain.

The Surveyor reported Boone County Could not meet today to form a joint Board with regards to the Moses Maxwell Drain.

Chairman, Don Maxwell tried to call the Boone County Surveyor and 2 commissioners, Mr. Robert Gurney and Mr. Robert Maze. No one was available. Mr. Maxwell stated we should try for a meetigg February 7, 1983. Maxwell stated the Montgomery County Board would try to be available at the Boone Countys schedule.

The Surveyor stated the engineers with Raybestoes were also unable to attend.

The Engineer is Mr. Beckia, he has talked with the Surveyor. Mr. Beckia ask Russ to verify the levels on the Shelly Drain, to get back with him, then they will reschedule a meeting.

The Surveyor discussed his meeting with Larry & Irene Smith. The Smiths met in the Surveyors Office, January 11, 1983 at 9:00 A.M. The Smiths were in agreement to let the Moore's Heights Drain cross their property, but only if they did not have to pay a reconstruction or maintenance fee and if an 8 inch tile was used.

Sam Boots moved and Don Maxwell seconded a motion to divide the Smiths maintenance fee equally among the remaining landowners. Motion passed.

The Surveyor discudded the Shelly Drain on 136 East. Mr. Ken Johnson is the local agent for Cardinal Industries Apartments.

Mr. Robert Hill, Engineer and Kevin Miller, Contractor on the Joseph Hall Drain did a sight inspection of the Hall Drain today. They inspected Line H.

Mr. Hill stated approximately 100 feet of bank is sloughing in and needs armoring.

Kevin Miller stated there is 5700 feet benched. He would go back in @ 1.25 per foot or \$7,000.00 on the deeper areas and maintain the road and slope the banks on a ratio of $1\frac{1}{2}$ to 1 foot. There is a little over a mile to do. Kevin stated they had seeded the banks, but it didn't take because of the time of seeding.

Sam Boots moved and Don Maxwell seconded a motion to approve Kevin Miller redoing the banks and maintenance road. This will be an addendum to the contract. There are also 2 other overruns on the contract. One concerning the culvert at 800 N & 150 East; and the farm crossing on Wally Kobels.

Kevin Miller stated he will move the existing pipe on 800 N further downstream and install a new pipe for \$700.00 (the new pipe will be 10 foot longer in length.

Sam Boots moved and Don Maxwell seconded a motion authorizing Kevin Miller to do such work on 800 N culvert. The motion passed.

Russ has talked to Curt Hudson about the bank at the culvert on 800 N. Mr. Hudson is concerned the bank will wash north of 800 and about the size of the pipe. Kevin stated he has buried the bridge abutment (at no charge) this was on Floyd Davidson Property just north of 550 North.

The Board instructed the Surveyors Office to pay \$1,985.00 taken and to the County Highway Deptment for the pipeon 800 North.

The Surveyor was requested to notify the landowners of the cost of the farm crossing as being \$1,985.00.

The Board signed one encumbrance on the John McLaughlin Drain. (Engineering Cost). Encumbrance Total \$1,539.93

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Russ discussed with the Board, Shelly Drain (near Raymark) Russ has shot levels on this drain. There is 6 inch fall in 700 feet.

Russ stated they have 2 alternatives.

1. Remove manhole and run tile around the new building and clear the outlet near Railroad

2. Maintain a pump at the manhole.

Russ stated he favors step one (1).

Sam Boots moved and Bob Thayer seconded a motion instructing Russ to contact Raymark engineers to lay a new tile line. Motion unanimous.

Shelly Drain - near Cardinal Industries Apartments.

Mr. Ken Johnson, is the project engineer.

Russ has been checking the area for the drainage problem. After contacting the water company. Water Co. stated they could not recall cutting any tile lines and the water lines had been buried to a depth of 46 inches.

Russ is going to recommend Cloverdale H ights (Mr. Portland) and Cardinal Industries lay approximately 20 to 30 feet of new tile.

The Moore's Heights Drain was discussed. Russ presented a copy of the letter sent to Mrs. Irene Smith (and son Larry Smith) Since Mrs. Smith has deceased the Drain will be delayed until further notice. Bart Maxwell, contractor, has not signed the contract as of yet, he called the Surveyors Office recently and stated he would be in to sign the contract, as of yet has not done so.

The hiring of a County Engineer was discussed. The Surveyor stated he has several petitions already turned into his office awaiting action. He felt the only thing he could do at this point is to suggest that landowners have reconstruction done as a group action or assume the engineering fees. In the future petitions will have attached a bond and a clause concerning engineering cost. (Unless the Commissioners decide to hire an engineer).

Don Maxwell, Chairman, phoned Don A. Yount and ask him to meet with the Board at this session. The Board ask Don what fee he would charge to stamp drainage plans? Yount stated he would think about the fee amount and get back to the Board on February 23, 1983 meeting.

Russ stated according to the Burns Statute Book (36-9-27-30 or 36-9-27-31) a surveyor can be employed on a part time basis. Russ also did not think landowners would want to absorb the extra engineering cost on a drain. Two-three days work on each ditch plan would be sufficient. This fee could be charged to the drainage project. With the Board setting the amount of fee for each plan.

The Montgomery County Drainage Board met Tuesday, February 22, 1983, 2:00 P.M. in the Auditors Office. Those present were Chairman, Don Maxwell; Vice-Chairman, Sam Boots; Member, Bob Thayer; Auditor, Mary Helen Carter; Surveyor, Russ Nelson (arriving late) and Engineer, Don A. Yount.

The Board signed the addendums on the Joseph Hall Drain a. an increase of \$2,698.72 and b. an increase of \$7,700.00.

The Board signed one encumbrance in the amount of \$ 1,234.90 Lee Swank 223.80; Don Maxwell 176.08; Bruce Osborn 176.08; Warren McGaughey 621.90; Journal-Review 8.11; The Frankfort Times 4.70; Journal Courier 5.38 and Russ Nelson 18.85.

Don A. Yount discussed the salary of a qualified deputy.

Don stated he would charge \$30.00 per hour to review all ditch plans and to use his seal. Or charge \$ 15.00 per hour if he worked with Russ in drafting ditch plans.

It is the Drainage Board who sets this salary.

The Board discussed what happens when the drain is vetoed at the reconstruction hearings? Russ stated this is what the petition bond covers. Russ also reported that on the 6 drains that are ready to be reconstructed he has already sent the petition bonds.

Don Maxwell ask how many hours of work on each drain would Don Yount require. Yount stated this would be hard to say as each drain would be different, depending on the size of the watershed. Maxwell also stated Yount had ask for a very fair fee.

Sam Boots moved and Bob Thayer seconded a motion authorizing Russ to hire Don A. Yount as a qualified deputy \$ 15.00 / hour. (Salary is to be charged to which ever drain they would be working on). Motion unanimous.

The Board ask for the balance in the General Drain Improvement Fund. \$ 47,671.62 .

Russ discussed with the Board, Darrell Birge not having a bond on the Joseph Ludlow Drain. Birge said due to the death of his brother & business partner to post a bond now would entagle the estate for a year, which he did not want to do.

The Board instructed Russ to meet with Birge and get a performance bond. Also to have him sign the contract and check the finishing date schedule.

The Board ask Russ to also check the finishing date on the Joseph Hall Drain.

Don Maxwell reviewed with the secretary the members of the joint board established February 7, 1983 (Joint with Boone County)

The Board is as follows: Chairman Don Maxwell; Vice-Chairman; Robert Maze; Members; Sam-Boots representing Montgomery County and Robert Gurnsey representing Boone County. The members also to be paid \$ 35.00 per meeting.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

The Montgomery County Drainage Board met Monday, March 21, 1983 1:40 P.M. in the Auditors Office. Those present were Vice-Chairman, Sam Boots; Member, Bob Thayer, Auditor, Mary Helen Carter; Attorney, Warren McGaughey; and Surveyor, Russ Nelson.

Russ presented a letter from Wernle, Ristine & Ayres. Mr. Ayres, Attorney, is representing Mr. Meade. (RE: Shelly Drain).

The Surveyor discussed correspondence with Cloverdale Apartments and Cardinal Industries.

Cloverdale Apartments need to connect a tile line into the catch basin and it has been suggested Cardinal lay new tile line to the catch basin.

Ken Johnson of Cardinal is not very receptive to laying a new tile line. He has ask for a map showing the Shelly Drain, which the Surveyors Office does not have.

Mr. Ayres ask if Cardinal Industries was agreeable if landowners could supply a backhoe if they could dig up a part of the drain. Russ has not been able to locate the exact line of Shelly Drain.

The Board ask how the McLaughlin Drain was progressing. Russ stated the final hearing will be April 21, 1983, 7:30 P.M.

Russ stated Darrell Birge was to bring in his bid bond regarding the Joseph Ludlow Drain. The Board was anxious for this drain to be completed as it is only about 60 days till planting and landowners will be wanting to work in the field.

Boots Bros. Oil Co. bill and Kevin Miller were discussed. Phil Boots had called the Surveyors Office and ask for the phone number and address of Kevin Miller.

Moores Heights Drain was discussed. Warren McGaughey suggested Russ call Aquilla Groves concerning the Irene Smith Estate. The Board would like for this project to get finished before spring.

The Board agreed to share (from the Drainage Board equip. account) the cost of a chain saw. Russ has purchased a 16 inch Pioneer saw. The Board stated the Township Trustees should pay a part of maintaining and pay the gas bills for using the saws. This is in regards to the Trustees work program. David Layton is going to start this program in Madison Township.

Russ phoned Kent Overholser, Boone County Surveyor, to verify there would not be a meeting today. The Moses Maxwell Drain landowners are going to go private action with this drain. There will be no further joint boards unless otherwise notified.

Mr. Robert Hill has ask to meet with the Drainage Board at their next night meeting which will be March 29, 1983, 7:00 P.M.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

This is in regards to the John McLaughlin Drain.

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The Montgomery County Drainage Board met March 29, 1983 in the Auditors Office. Those present were Chairman, Don Maxwell; Vice-Chairman, Sam Boots, Member, Bob Thayer; Attorney, Warren McGaughey; Auditor, Mary Helen Carter; Surveyor, Russ Nelson; Engineer, Robert Hill.

Kevin has started back to work by the Co-op. He has started putting in pipes. He has not started leveling and tapering behind the shelf.

The percent completed is approximately 70 to 80 percent. Maxwell stated he has received several calls stating part of the ditch banks are sloughing in.

Sub-contractors have 60 days from the time the work is completed or materials are delivered to collect pay. Fairfield Contractors and Boots Brothers Oil have filed letters with the Surveyors Office. Miller and Fairfield are not in agreement on the hours. They are in the process of working this out. Miller has said he would be paying Boots Oil shortly.

The Board is questioning the time limit on Fairfields. Fairfields have been trying to get their money since November of 1982. But they did not sign a sub-contractors contract from the Surveyors Office.

The Attorney suggested Kevin come to the next Board meeting. April 4th, 1983, 2:30 P.M.

It was stated some bills could be paid from the 10% retainage but this would only amount to \$ 25,000.00. The Surveyors Office is to keep a close account of what Kevin has been paid and any outstanding bills.

Mr. Oswalt on the Hall Drain, is upset about the farm crossing on this Drain, he feels he has paid enough. Oswalt would need to pay one half of the cost. The other 50% has been figured in the project cost. Mr. Oswalt has 80 acres in the drainage area. The pipe has already been paid for. The Board stated they would go ahead and proceed, as landowners had agreed to paying 50% of any farm crossing. Miller has agreed to get the pipe for \$ 500.00 to \$ 700.00.

Russ had met Monday with Attorney, Jim Ayers, Cloverdale Apts. and Cardinal industries. Cloverdale (Mr. Portwood) could not find the pipe they had installed. Mr. Johnson (Cardinal Industries) stated they had not removed any pipes or tile and does not feel they should lay any new tile, as the Surveyor can not locate the tile line. Cloverdale state they have already done the work, and why should they pay to redo it? No problems seemed evident until Cardinal started building. Mr. Johnson stated they had gotten all permits from the City and state that they have no knowledge of needing to confer with the Surveyors Office. The Board suggested a meeting be set up with, Attorney, Jim Ayers and Engineer, Ralph Willis. The Attorney, Mr. McGaughey ask for a set of drawings as to what kind of storm sewers and sanitary connections are needed, The Board wants a copy of such plans at the next meeting. The Surveyor was instructed to set a date and time, preferrably April 4, 1983 for the Board to meet with Mr. Willis.

Russ has been to the City Water Co. and ask when they laid the water lines if they had encountered any tile. They stated no and this is quite possible as the water lines are 46 inches deep. And the Shelly Drain is out of probe depth.

Russ reported on Shelly Drain and Raymark, they are not receptive to running a new tile. The attorney stated they should try to get them to attend the April 18th, 1983 meeting.

Bob Thayer ask about progress on the Ludlow Drain. The completion date is the last of May of this year.

Russ meet with Jesse Howard and ask Mr. Howard if they could bring the open drain about 300 to 400 feet into his field. This was out of the question.

Written objections to the McLaughlin Drain need to be in the Surveyors Office 5 days before the hearing date, which is April 21st, 1983, 7:30 P.M. This means the objection date is April 16th, 1983. There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

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The Montgomery County Drainage Board met Monday, April 4th, 1983, 11:05 AM, in the Auditors Office. Those present were Chairman, Don Maxwell (arriving late); Vice-Chairman, Sam Boots; Member, Bob Thayer; Auditor, Mary Helen Carter; Surveyor, Russ Nelson; City-Engineer, Ralph Willis; Attorney, Warren McGaughey; Attorney, Jim Ayers; landowners, Mr. Mead, Ron Sutherlin, Larry Davis and Morris Davis.

This meeting was to discuss the drainage problem on Shelly Drain. The Surveyor reported Cloverdale Apartments built a 24 inch storm sewer that empties at a catch basin on Traction Road.

Cardinal Industries have placed a catch basin on top of the existing tile (Shelly Drain).

The tile coming into the catch basin to serve road 136 is missing. The Surveyor and Cloverdale engineers could find no trace. Dye has been used from Mr. Meades but the Surveyor could not find where this was outletting. The tile line is too deep to probe in this area. Cardinal Industries did not want to put in a new tile line.

Mr. Willis stated they could probe and use a camera to locate the problem. Also a steel tape could be inserted in the tile and with a metal detector the tile line could be flagged.

Mr. Willis also stated he had an inspector on the job every day. And any damage was repaired. Many parts of the tile were clogged with silt.

To add to the problem, Shelly Drain is not on assessment. The County has no money to work on this drain.

Attorney, Jim Ayres stated if Cardinal Industries was at fault could they be billed for expenses incurred on this project.

Drainage problems did not seem to arise until Cardinal Industries started their apartment complex.

Mr. Willis suggested the occupancy permit could be delayed until a thorough investigation of this tile is completed.

Correspondenance regarding this is attached to todays minutes. The County Attorney stated a new drain could be constructed then abandon the old tile line which is in very bad condition.

Cardinal Industries did not contact the Surveyors Office in regards to any kind of drainage or tiling. The City is responsible for sewers and storm drains. The County is responsible for farm drainage and this drain is an existing old tile line, combined with the fact it lies on the outer edge of the city.

The Surveyor will make an in depth study as to the exact location of the tile line, and also what would be the best solution to the drainage problem. Tehn have a meeting with the engineers of Cardinal Industries.

Mr. Willis stated he would help Russ in any way he could. There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

The Montgomery County Drainage Board met Monday, April 4, 1983 2:11 P.M. Those present were Chairman, Don Maxwell; Vice-Chairman, Sam Boots; Member, Bob Thayer; Auditor, Mary Helen Carter; Attorney, Warren McGaughey; Surveyor, Russ Nelson, Engineer, Robert Hill, and Contractor, Kevin Miller (arriving later)

The Surveyor reported on the Allen Lewis Drain. Mr. Floyd Geiger was in the Surveyors Office, landowners have had the drain cleaned (private action). One landowner now does not want to have work don² on her property (the former Mrs. Haney). Robert Thayer reported Mrs. Haney was in favor of cleaning thru her part, Evidently after talking to the farm manager, Leon Weber, she has changed her mind. Mrs. Haney is on the lower end of the drain which is not in the actual assessed part of the Lewis Drain.

The easements on the John McLaughlin Drain was discussed (Ora Gish, Ruth McLaughlin and Dwight Davidson).

A petition to place on maintenance - the Warner E. Linn and Daniel Himes Drain was presented to the Board. The Surveyor stated the only thing he could foresee was possibly the headwall will need to be repaired. Bob Thayer moved and Sam Boots seconded a motion to accept said petition.

The Board signed the contract on the Joseph Ludlow Drain. The completion date is May 30th, 1983.

The Surveyor discussed Statute # 36-9-27-20 which states drains located in municipalities or sanitary districts if they will so accept could have jurisdiction over the Shelly Drain. The Surveyor has shot levels on the drain from Traction Road to Highway 32. There is $9\frac{1}{2}$ feet of fall in this $\frac{1}{2}$ mile.

Kevin Miller phoned stating he would be arriving late.

The Board discussed a letter from Fairfield Contracors and Boots Bros Oil Co. Robert Hill stated before final payment (10%) can paid, all outstanding bills have to be paid. (Fairfield Contractors \$ 6,545.00) and Boots Bros Oil Co. \$3,566.27). Mr. Miller stated he is working with Fairfield on this he is questioning what they have charged, (the hours) he stated he would soon be paying Boots Bros. Oil. They stated they did not like to interfer and act as a collection agency, but the Board does not want to be liable for any contractors outstanding bills.

The charge for building a shelf on the Joe Hall Drain is \$ 7,000.00 Kevin stated he has not started on this. Bob Hill stated seeding will be 5 feet from the top of the banks.

Kevin reported he has started installing the surface inlet pipes.

The pipe on 550 N & 200 E (off Cassidy Blacktop) pipes are in good shape, they just need to be lowered. Kevin stated he would be back to work on this. If new pipes are needed, the highway will provide the pipe. Kevin stated he was sure the pipes could be salvaged.

Kevin has not statted work on moving the pipe on 800 North. The Board ask about the amount for 1982 settlement of the Hall Drain. The amount was \$ 123,112.32.

Moores Heights Drain was discussed.

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The secretary had written to Attorney, Mr. Groves. Mr. Groves stated he was forwarding this to Mr. Larry Smith. Larry is executor of the late Mrs. Irene Smith Estate.

Bart Maxwell has contacted the Surveyor Office about paying for the bond on the Moore Heights Drain. The Board stated they would not pay this.

The minutes were read and approved.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

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The Montgomery County Drainage Board met Monday, April 18, 1983, in the Auditors Office. Those present were Chairman, Don Maxwell; Vice Chairman, Sam Boots; Member, Bob Thayer; Attorney, Warren McGuaghey; Auditor, Mary Helen Carter; Surveyor, Russ Nelson; Contractor, Darrell Birge, Jeff Morrison; and the following landowners/ Jesse Irvin, Jim Fulwider, Charles Cooley, Ed Sutherlin, Jesse Howard, John Greenburg, Willis Surface, Earl Smith, Derlan Beardsley, and Luther Lofland representing First National Bank.

The Board ask the Surveyor what was the delay on the Ludlow Drain. Russ stated getting a bid bond and the weather. Bid bond was turned in the Surveyors Office, April 8, 1983.

Jesse Howard was upset about the Drain not being finished, thru his property.

Darrell Birge stated the tile trucks were loaded and ready. But they need to wait until the ground is solid enough to move the heavy trucks.

Howard stated they could come into his pasture, but to keep on the ditch right-of-way (which is 75 feet on either side of the ditch banks) to maintain said ditch.

There are 20 inch all new tile thru Howards property. Completion date is May 30, 1983. This is 1,693 feet of new tile.

Birge stated he would stay on the 75 foot easement, when he traveled the ditch.

Any reseeding will need to come from the maintenance fund (this will be an addendum to the contract).

The lateral on Willis Surface will be repaired.

Earl Smith stated he has 80 rods of tile going thru 51 acres to be planted in corn. He ask if all landowners involved would be paid for the damages.

Jesse Irvin stated every landowner should be responsible for any damage while the reconstruction is being done.

Russ stated the ditch would be rerouted around the two culverts. Russ stated the open ditch would be leveled and seeded.

All landowners will share this expense.

Mr. Howard thought it would all be leveled and seeded. (the open and the tiled).

Russ - the old tile line will remain, but be abandon. Some fill dirt will be required to fill in the old tile line.

Chairman, Don Maxwell, ask if the tile lines could not be done first then do the other work on Howards. Birge stated the pipe would need to be placed on Howards first. Mr. Howard was concerned about his fence (for the cattle). Jesse Irvin ask about the fill dirt.

Mr. Howard stated he had a hill that the contractor could scalp for the fill dirt. The old tile line lies 15 - 20 feet from where the new line will be placed. Bob Thayer moved and Sam Boots seconded a motion for Darrel Birge to proceed with the project.

The bid let for \$ 39,976.69 .

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Bob Thayer instructed the secretary to remail a tax assessment from Carl Thompson to Michael Meritt.

b. Run a new tile line approximately 675 to 700 feet

c. Install a lift station

Mr. Newman stated if it was the man hole that upset the Board, they would remove it. They had the Fire Dept. run water into the tile line but they never found the outlet. They also used dye and styrofoam pellets, also not getting any results. They felt the manhole was an improvement. Mr. Ward stated the railroad spur had been removed.

Russ suggested they could lower the swale all around the Ray mark Building $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet. And also lower the pipes under the railroad and the railroad spur.

The Surveyor wanted the Board to be aware, in case at a later date problems do arise, his opinion on the manhole built at Raymark.

Mr. Newman stated with not being able to find the outlet, the manhole was as good a solution as any.

Raymark stated they were not having any water problems at this time.

There not being an assessment on this drain, makes it impossible to do any repairs on this Shelly Drain.

Maxwell stated he thought the manhole had probably relieved the water back pressure.



A called Montgomery County Drainage Board meeting was held in the Building Commissioners Office, Basement of the Courthouse, Crawfordsville, Indiana, Friday, June 10, 1983 at 9:15 A.M. 12

Those present were Chairman, Don Maxwell; Attorney, Warren McGaughey; Surveyor, Russ Nelson; Mr. Matt Ayres of the Lizton State Bank, Richard Cunningham of Associated Planners & Designers and Mr. Kevin Miller of Miller Excavating, Lebanon, Indiana.

Chairman, Don Maxwell called the meeting to order. This meeting was called to discuss the unpaid invoices of Mr. Kevin Miller regarding the reconstruction of the Joseph Hall Drain. And to discuss the progressive payments due Mr. Miller.

Mr. Hill, Engineer with Associated Planners & Designers has not been figuring the retainage of 10% to be held by the County, correctly. He has been holding only about 7%. At this date \$ 6,287.77 is due on the retainage fee. \$ 14,671.47 retainage has been withheld. Mr. Miller has been paid \$ 194,920.92.

Kevin stated he would have some pipes to return to Ladoga Culvert for credit.

Two The contract bid was \$231,311.31. There have been tow (2) addendums both increases: \$7,700.00 and \$2,698.72 (for work on the multi-plate) Bringing the total to \$241,710.03 plus extra work.

The project could be completed in 3 weeks if Miller Excavating had poperating cash. At this time Mr. Miller is working other projects trying to accomplish this.

Mr. Cunningham suggested Kevin finish the project as soon as possible then he would have a 30 day waiting period for the remaining dollars due - in the amount of \$ 249,000.00. He also suggested the Board cut the retainage fee to 5% and modify the contract as such.

Mr. McGaughey stated this would jeapordize the Drainage Board and would not be in the best interest of the Board. The only thing that can be done is to make up for the shortage in retainage and continue to hold the required 10% and pay out the contract according to the drainage laws. Even if the correct amound had been withheld it would not cover the outstanding bills. 12

Mr. Ayres ask for a list and a copy of all outstanding bills. Extra work on the project was discussed. Landowners have been having Kevin Search for tiles (which the Surveyor states are 90% private tile lines) and tying into the main line. Kevin, Mr. Hill and Russ are to go over all completed work and seperate the work as to which was in the original contract and what should be paid for over and above the contract price.

From now on Mr. Miller is to be paid on the spot for such work by the landowners.

The Chairman, instructed the Secretary to deliver the check which the Board has held on Miller Excavating / Lizton State Bank. Check # F 5818 in the amount of \$ 5,195.16.

ISSUE:

Reconstruction of tributary emptying into John Gobin Ditch II. (Map)

BACKGROUND:

OUND: The area east of highway drains about 150 acres. There has been a problem their for several years with four inch rains producing ponds up to five feet in depth drounding out 10 to 20 acres. Small rains are now producing almost as bad of a problem. In the past four years, we have excavated on both sides of railroad and highway looking for obstructions and broken tile and none were found. This past summer the 15 inch main was located in the low ground east of highway where we found it 95% full of a black silty sand.

RECOMMENDATION: It is my recommendation to reconstruct this tributary with the same size tile and taking the same general route as the present one.

CONSEQUENCE:

It is coming a time to reconstruct county tile that was put in many years ago. Today it is this tributary, tomorrow it will be my neighbors in which he will need my support in replacing a tile even though it does not directly benefit me. If this tributary of the County Drainage System is not replaced at the present time, cost will increase and income will belost. Our public health will be in jeopardy in this area one-halfmile south of Linden by becoming a permanent ponding area.

The Surveyors Office has written to the Company but they have not replied. Warren instructed the Secretary to furnish him with the address of the Guard Casualty and Surety Company.

Sam Boots moved and Bob Thayer seconded a motion to have Mr. McGaughey reply to the bonding company via registered letter.

The Board instructed the Surveyor to get a report together on the Hall Drain. Mr. Hill and the Surveyor, Russ are to inspect the ditch site. This is to be completed by February 20, 1984. Mr. Dave Sabens has offered the use of his tractor on the site inspection.

Mr. Dewey Hauser spoke to the Board regarding Mr. Millers bill to Ladoga Culvert Co. for pipe they furnished on this (Hall) project.

A partial payment has been made to Ladoga Culvert. The checks were confusing as to what were invoices (ordered by the Surveyors Office) and what was to be paid on Millers account.

Mr. Hauser has filed a lein against Miller in regards to this.

Mr. Hauser reported to the Surveyors Office, Friday, January 20th, 1984. The Office will be sending a report to Ladoga Culvert in regards to the retainage withheld and the payments to Ladoga Culvert Company. This will be after Mr. Hill's meeting with Russ and after Kevin as turned in his final billing.

Don Maxwell stated Kevin has some pipe to return to Ladoga Culvert - - Mr. Hauser stated that was between Ladoga Culvert and Kevin and had nothing to do with the business here today.

The Board issued a deadline of November 28, 1983 to Mr. Miller as the final completion date.

The Montgomery County Drainage Board met Monday, February 6, 1984 at 1:40 P.M. in the Auditors Office. Those present were Chairman, Bob Thayer; Vice-Chairman, Sam Boots; Member, Don Maxwell; Auditor, Mary Helen Carter; Surveyor, Russ Nelson; Engineer, Robert Hill. Attending later were Wally Kobel and Bill Todd. Joseph Hall Drain Report:

Russ and Bob Hill have walked and drove the Hall Drain. They reshot some levels in 4 or 5 places. There was 1 to 2 feet of dirt settled in the bottom of the ditch. The banks need to be reseeded. Kevin reported to Russ he has the tickets where he purchased grass seed. He stated he seeded the banks, but it did not grow.

Many landowners preferred leaving the banks as they are and reseed perhaps 2 times as opposed to trying to smooth the banks and risk further erosion. Mr. Hill stated Kevins checks would be held until the Board is satisfied that the seeding shows signs of a good growth.

Kevin has buried some material on the Sabens property.

Kevin feels he has finished this project with one exception and this is to place some stone by the Co-op Elevator.

Mr. Hill and Russ have been rechecking to make sure the pipes were all placed.

There is a bad wash at the rock shute near 150 North. Some things are not to easy to see because of the snow.

Russ suggested the Board look at the shelf on the North side of the ditch. Seven thousand dollars extra was paid to Kevin to build this. The maintenance shelf now is not wide enough to drive on, so it is useless.

Two pipes have been put in by private landowners, one on Sabens and one on Bart Maxwell and the pipes are on the bottom of the ditch. They were wanting to not have to use their pump stations. Russ suggested leaving the pumps in.

Don Maxwell ask if Hill & Russ thought the project was completed? Russ stated:

1. He was not satisfied with the travel berm.

2. The seeding is also to be redone.

3. The ditch banks - Russ ask how are you going to approach this? Russ stated you would not achieve much by trying to widen the banks (as this type of soil would erode very badly. You could armor, all armoring according to the specs was not used. The specs called for 600 tons of armor and only 60 tons were actually used. Russ also stated the banks were sloped according to the ditch plans. Robert Hill reporter \$ 23,876.00 is with held. Kevin has turned in a bill for 3 or 4,000.00 The project bid for \$ 29,876.00 and with the addendums it totals approximately \$ 250,000.00.

As of October 20, 1983:

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There was \$ 238,766.68 work done. Kevin Miller has been paid \$ 207,664.73. Creditors have been paid \$ 7,725.28 The amount with held is \$ 23,876.67.

Due the creditors is \$ 23,891.00

Kevin will be returning some pipes to Ladoga Culver g_{2} Russ stated the one pipe that is 30' x 21" and a flared end section will be purchased to place on Hatkes property.

The Board needs to instruct Kevin what needs to be done to complete the project and state a deadline. The following is to be stated in a letter to Kevin Miller.

1. To reseed

2. Place some armor (near Hudsons)

3. Finish burying some rock & debris.

Give Kevin 30 days after the weather breaks - between April 15th and May 15th.

Kevin has billed the office for some work regarding his searching for landowners tiles. This is to be paid by the landowners. Kevin charged on a per hour basis,

Bill Todd ask that the bridge be buried deeper (this is near 150 East) as it definitely is not below plow depth.

The letter to Kevin is also to incorporate the following:

a. To reseed and results are to be seen by May 15th

b. Bury the concrete near 150 East on Todds

c. Work on the N rth maintenance road

d. Place armor near (Boyd Hudsosn)

Russ suggested that armoring could be done so much per year and pay from the Maintenance Fund. Don Maxwell was not in favor of this.

Chairman, Bob Thayer read the Surveyors Report, said report attached.

The Chairman ask if the landowners had any questions.

Russ Nelson reported the Drain started on the Carroll Graham property and ended at Highway 234. The drain is in excess of 2 miles in length.

One landowner ask if landowners who kept the drain in good condition thru their property would be credited on the reconstruction cost? Bob Thayer and Sam Boots stated No. No allowances would be made.

Russ stated the Board did have the authority to set assessments and landowners could be assessed a lower rate. The Board has the option to change any of the Surveyors recommendations.

Russ stated that todays meeting was to get the opinion of landowners if they would pay the engineers fee to work up plans on this Drain.

The drain is West of 234 and East of 200 West. The acres total 3,469.

The Chairman stated the first decision to be made would be which recommendation of the Surveyor they wanted to do Plan I or Plan II; to agree to hire an engineer, then hold a hearing on reconstruction. The average engineering cost is \$ 1.00 to \$ 1.50 per acre.

A motion was made to proceed with the engineering. Motion dies for lack of a second.

One third of the landowners hare were on the brance which will not benefitt greatly by the reconstruction. They would only have about 200 feet of drain reconstructed.

Mr. Himes questioned the acres he had in this watershed. Russ stated he would recheck this. ,

stated he would recheck this. Carroll Graham moved and Chester Himes seconded a notion to proceed with the engineering. This project will go to County Road 1,000 South, this is Recommendation II.

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The Chairman ask that only landowners involved in this area, vote. Those in favor were, Carroll Graham, Chester Himes, Gerald Simpson and Garry McCutchan. None opposed.

Don Maxwell moved and Sam Boots seconded a motion instructing Don A. Yount to proceed with engineering in accordance with recommentation II. Motion unanimous.

The Hearing adjourned ant the Board reconvened in the Auditors Office. Those also attending in the Auditors Office were Attorney, Warren McGaughey, Auditor, Mary Helen Carter and Kurt Hudson.

Mr. Hudson approached the Board to ask if there was anyway he could get help to repair (by lowering the tile line) on the Gobin Drain. He ask if this could be paid out of the maintenance fund. The Board stated, No. This would entail boring under the Railroad and the State Highway.

Russ suggested calling the landowners again and asking if they would object to help pay this out of the maintenance fund. This cost is for the tile on the East side of Highway 43 North.

Mr. Kurt Hudson and Charles Bennett are going to pay all but \$ 8,455.00 of the bill. The total bill is \$ 22,000.00.

Mr. Hudson stated he wanted some guide lines. The landowners stated they would not oppose Kurt and he didn't bring anyone to the meeting. Kurt stated he has paid his share of the reconstruction and he still has water problems. Landowners have ask Kurt for a dollar amount for putting a tile under the highway (a larger one) and running it thru the small hill and going over and catching the pocket and the tile would drain everything East of the Highway, this would be about 300 acres. If we put this in on the 300 acres on our own, in 10 years we don't want to pay on repairs, if now they don't want to help pay on ours (this is in regards to the 300 acres). This 300 acres consists of Kurt Hudson, Charles Bennett, Spitznagles, Faust and Heinold property. Kurt ask for some ground rules "I'm not going to spend 10 to 15 thousand dollars of my money and have to pay another 2 thousand in a few years on their tiling."

Attorney, Warren McGaughey stated Kurt should do this on a petition - then withdraw from the main Gobin Drain and he put on a seperate ditch. This drain on East side of 43 North consists of approximately 300 acres. In later years then he may have to pay a

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small assessment because the Gobin will be the outlet for this new tile line. Also, Kurt should try to get 51% of the acres involved to sign the petition.

Russ discussed with the Board about stocking a few tiles and using plastic tiles.

Russ stated in some ditch repairs they were using some plastic.

According to the A.D.S. salesman, Chester "Jake" Fox plastic tile has passed all testing, and they have a 20 year guarantee on their product.

Warren McGaughey ask why would we want to stock tile?

Russ stated that on repairing short sections of a tile line, the inconvenience of going a long distance plus the charge for delivering a small quantity of tiles. The Company Mr. Fox is with is located in Monticello, IL. Thriftys here in the City, carry some tile but it is in the smaller sizes and plus it is quite expensive.

Warren stated that we didn't want to go into business against Thriftys.

Russ stated no, but we try to keep 3 or 4 extra tiles in case of breakage and they are left on the ditch.

Warren ask how we get our money for the tile?

Thayer stated it was charged directly to the ditch.

Warren stated he doubted if we could do this, as by purchasing tile from each maintenance fund could mean the drain could go on assessment and no work was being done on the drain.

Russ ask about purchasing and charging from the General Drainage Improvement Fund.

Warren stated it could be purchased from this fund if the Improvement fund had enough money in it. But you would have to reimburse this fund.

Don Maxwell ask if this would save money?

Russ reported yes, you would save on the delivery charge and on the tile price.

Warren stated Russ could possibly make arrangements with the County Highway in regards to storing the tile. Warren suggested that Russ approach the Board with this at a later time.

COMMENT:

This was originally Jones & Armstrong Ditch - 1881, Commissioners Record Book II.: In 1929 this ditch was repaired and extended 9,400 feet and now goes under the name of John S & Sarah Niven Ditch.

The Surveyor of Montgomery County finds that the total length of the John & Sarah Nivens Ditch could be cleared and dredged for better all around drainage as well as better tile outlets. This would also include Tributary # 1 to Jones & Armstrong Ditch.

RECOMMENDATIONS # I

The Surveyor of Montgomery County would recommend to the Montgomery County Drainage Board that the Wm. T. Davis Ditch, the Robert M. Niven Ditch and Wm. T. Servies Ditch be combined with the John S. & Sarah Niven Ditch into one general drainage area; if this reconstruction goes through and place said area on maintenance, this will eliminate double assessment and simplify the general assessment.

RECOMMENDATION # 11

The Surveyor of Montgomery County would recommend to the Montgomery County Drainage Board that if it appears to be impossible or impractical to reconstruct all of the John & Sarah Niven Ditch; That the Board consider reconstruction from the headwall on the main line to County Highway 1000 South and Tributary # 1 to the Jones & Armstrong Ditch and place said portion on maintenance.

Don Maxwell moved and Sam Boots seconded a motion to take all bids under advisements. Motion unanimous.

The Board discussed with Bart Maxwell the completion date of the drain as Bart was the lowest bidder. Bart stated 90 days to finish the project and he could start in 3-4 days. He stated also there would be very little crop damage.

Russ stated 8 foot is the deepest cut on this drain.

The Board (Don Maxwell) stated Don Yount should attend all bid openings.

The Board discussed the Joseph Hall Drain.

Kevin Miller is to have the project finished by May 15, 1984.

The ditch banks are very eroded as seeding was not done immediately after dredging was done.

The bottom of the ditch is filled with $1\frac{1}{2}$ to 2 feet of sand and silt on the Hobart Mennen property.

Bart Maxwell stated this is the poorest job of reconstruction he has seen. He stated the tile pipes (where extended from the banks) are sagging. Ruts to deep on the banks for grass to grow. Some landowners paid \$ 90.00 per acre and they have not got their dollars worth out of the end results. He also discussed with the Board a claim for \$ 600.00 which has not been paid. Russ has discussed this with Kevin and he informed Kevin if he did not pay this then it would be taken from his retainage fee. Bart ask if the Bonding Company couldn't be contacted. Warren McGaughey stated he has sent 3 registered letters, none have ever received a reply.

 - B. Russ will recheck the tile outlet.

- B. The cement on DeVores is for a County Highway Project, not this drainage project.

5. Mennen ask that 7 to 8 thousand feet of the ditch be dipped out due to silt.

Bart Maxwell asked that the culvert be lowered.

Chairman, Bob Thayer asked Kevin How much time and the cost involved to lower this pipe.

Kevin answered 3 days to a week and \$ 2,000 to \$ 2,500.

Sloughing of ditch banks.

Robert Walters stated he did not want two channels thru his property. He wanted the old channel filled in unless the county wanted to purchase the land. Walters again stated this contract was taken from the specifications given by the Surveyor and the Board has a copy of the same.

The Board read the contract between Walters & E.B. Foster. The contract makes no stipulation regarding the completion date and no provision for a bond was made.

The Board discussed the stumps that have been left on the ditch banks. Russ stated they should be removed in leiu of painting them.

Don Yount stated the ditch does Not need to be lowered (thru Walters Property). Get on Foster and get him moving and finish the job. E.B. has known about all of these proceedings since the first of Bebruary. In the mean time contractors Reinholt & VanHorn are starting to work on this drain.

Shairman Kessler suggested Walters get some one else to finish the job.

Walt Nelson voiced his concerns as follows:

A. Ask if the 2 small tubes on 550 would be removed and a larger pipe placed here? Wants a decision from the Board today. Thayer answered Yes with reservations. If a larger pipe is placed, a new bridge will need to be put in; Robert Walters quaded from the June 20, 1984 meeting minutes "or a new prestressed bridge structure. Don A. Yount suggested placing another tube (making 3 in all) of the existing size. This would carry more water than one larger pipe and at a lesser cost. The consensus was that the two tubes could(be used elsewhere if they opted to place one tube.

b. on 650 will both sides of the drain be cleaned? Walt Nelson stated if the North side were cleaned then too much water would move and wouldn't rip-rap need to be placed on both sides?

Don Yount stated if the channel were cleaned on both sides the water would spread out and slow down. Nelson responded that "it would be good for the upland - bad for him." He objected to this plan.

c. Walt Nelson stated he wanted tile provided by Walters straightened and run into the new channel. He (Walt Nelson) will be willing to pay the cost difference. He definately does not want to tye into the Harris 15 inch tile, provided by Walters to the new creek cut. Walt Nelson wants the two tile lines to be the same height and to angle into the new channel with the water flow.

Mr. Walters stated (record of phone call) he had called Walt Nelson in Mesa, Arizona and informed him of the program, not asking for financial assistance.

Chairman Kessler stated "it was Bob Walters' responsibility to extend the tile as Bob wanted the channel changed."

Bob Walters stated "he didn't change the channel, it was the engineering design produced by Mr. Yount."

Bob Thayer suggested that at the next drainage meeting, they consult with County Attorney, Don Schmidt, about possibly breaking the contract (between Walters & E.B. Foster).

Bob Walters agreed to discuss the legality question with them. Walters stated then he would request the Board to refer to the original specifications on the Howard Cline Ditch which was changed and damaging to his property.

Mr. Kiley stated that in 1970 Florence Prawl paid a ditch assessment on this drain. After checking, the Surveyors Office could find no records to this effect.

Mr. asked about tying into the ditch at a later date with a private tile line. The Surveyor recommended that landowners file a map with the Surveyors Office showing location of private lines and no permits or charges would be made.

Also, questioned if extra dirt was needed, where would this come from? Harvey explained from other sections of the drain where excavation was done the extra dirt would be moved from one part of the drain to another - where needed.

He announced Nucor Steel would pay all reconstruction cost (based on todays estimate of \$48,372.50) if necessary they would also cover the allowable over-run cost of 10%, if this was agreeable with the Board. But landowners would be required to pay their maintenance assessments.

He also went on to explain that Nucor has built a holding pond, water used in the steel processing will not empty into the Epperson Drain, but will be channeled to the holding pond. Nucor will operate a waste water treatment plant for their company operations. Landowners should not be concerned that the quality of water will change with relation to the ditch.

April thru September is the appropriate time to do foliar spraying. The two chemicals best suited for ditch spraying is "Elanco" spike and Garlon chemicals.

The approximate cost of brush removal is \$2,000.00/acre. There is 3 acres per mile of drain.

Mr. Dalton will be sending a sample contract for Harvey to review.

Larry Utz reported on the follwing:

(a) In 1988, \$14,335.22 was spent for brush removal on 20 different drains.

(b) The following are drains in need of spraying:

Those attending are as follows: Chairman, Dr. Kirtley; Vice-Chairman, Sam Kessler; Member, Bob Thayer; Attorney, Don Schmidt; Surveyor, Harvey Keller; 1st Deputy Surveyor, Larry Utz; Auditor, Nell Hester; Keith Light of Linden; Boyd Hudson, landowner; Contractor, Jack Jones (arriving later) and Steve Leer, Journal Review.

Mr. Keith Light was here to discuss Bible's Addition located East of Linden. Mr. Bible is selling parcels of land. Many have placed mobile homes on these lots. There is a water problem in this area. The land is low and after any measurable rain the problem is compounded. Septic is seeping to the top of the soil. Mr. Light is concerned with this. The Health Office has been contacted (2x) Mr. Walters has not contacted our office with his findings. Unless a problem is on the main line of a legal drain, the drainage board has no jurisdiction. This property is drained by the George Nichols and James Hose Ditches.

Mr. Boyd Hudson was here to discuss the Charles Newkirk and Joseph Hall Drains.

Mr. Hudson ask that the Board correct the following items; (a) acres and assessment amounts for the Newkirk and Hall. The September 19,1983 drainage minutes set the maintenance assessment of the Hall Drain at \$.75 per acre.

(b) to redefine the watershed of the Newkirk Drain.

(c) \$2500.00 should be transferred to the Newkirk maintenance fund. (this money should have come from the Hall Drain).

When the Joseph Hall Drain was reconstructed in 1982 it encroached on the Charles Newkirk Drain. In some locations the Newkirk and Hall are the same ditch.

Old records state that the Newkirk Drain starts 958 feet East of the center of Section 29-Twp 19 North-Range 4 West. and runs due North. Mr. Hudson states the Newkirk now consists of 2 tile lines running East and West and all located North of County Road 800 North.

The Board were in agreement with Mr. Hudson and requested the Surveyor to do a field check and report back with Mr. Hudson.

Timothy Lane Drain

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Harvey and Jack Jones went to county road 625 East to measure the bridge span and figure the pipe size. (Near Walt Nelson property)

This culvert drains approximately 1,000 acres. The present culvert is not big enough to carry water especially in heavy rain. The water flows to within inches of the top of the pipe. The contractor and surveyor were concerned that if a larger pipe is installed how much would this raise the bridge deck.

Harvey anticipates going upstream 200 feet and placing a sediment trap. This will be done from the maintenance fund of the Lane Drain.

Sam Kessler moved and Bob Thayer seconded a motion approving Jack Jones to replace the above mentioned pipe/culvert.

Albert Hysong Drain

Harvey has tried several times to get a meeting date convenient with Mr. Al Huntsman, Surveyor of Hendricks County. Harvey is going to request the following:

(a) That Hendricks County waive its rights to serve on this joint board.

(b) Run a new tile line.

(c) Rework the side ditch as the ditch along the road (1025E) will never handle all the ditch water. The county road (1025E) washed considerably during the storm on May 25th.

<u>William</u> <u>Epperson</u> <u>Drain</u>

This drain held up excellent under the storm water drain off.

Sam Kessler moved and Bob Thayer seconded a motion to recess. Motion unanimous.

Chairman Marion Kirtley called the meeting to order. Those present were: Chairman; Marion Kirtley, Vice-Chairman; Sam Kessler, member; Bob Thayer, County Attorney; Don Schmidt, and Surveyor; Harvey Keller.

<u>William Epperson Ditch-</u> Harvey stated that they met with contractor, Ron Taylor, and drove and walked the entire length of the ditch. He had seeded behind his work and the banks were still intact and grass was growing, following a big rain. He did not use as much rip-rap as called for, but did locate more private tile and repaired it. We were to rip-rap culvert, but since it is to be pulled out, we didn't do it. He has done an excellent job, Harvey said, and he recommended paying him. Marion Kirtley seconded a motion from Sam Kessler to do so. County attorney, Don Schmidt, said that as soon as Harvey submitted a second claim form for payment, that Mr. Taylor could be paid. And further asked that Keith Busse, of Nucor, be out to look at it and approve it. Harvey stated he would ask him to inspect it and send Mr. Schmidt a form letter stating result of such.

Harvey said one of the Fauber engineers asked who was responsible for where the Epperson and Tobin drains met and banks had washed out from the last big rain. (They can't get rid of all of the water.) He said they were quite concerned about the water backing up, but that this was a landowners responsibility, and that it would worsen down stream on Denny Strasburgers land.

Joe Ludlow Ditch- was never done by Mr. Strasburger even though he was awarded the bid to do it. Therefore, he may not be co-operative on this (Epperson) drain either.

Mr. Kirtley asked if the gap between the two ditches would harm any of the work that had been done. Harvey said no, that the damage was done mostly to the side ditch and that the land between the ditches is on road right-of-way. Fauber Construction will rebuild it and place rip-rap.

ho, that the damage was done mostly to the side ditch and that the land between the ditches is on road right-of-way. Fauber Construction will rebuild it and place rip-rap. Harvey said that they did all the shots on <u>Camp Rotary</u> <u>Road</u> and the pipe on 625 E and that Larry and Nancy are seeing Keith Blaydes at the <u>William Davis Drain</u> at the present time about culvert pipe under 900 S.

Also, that they have ten other ditch jobs, but no funds to do them.

He said they haven't heard from Hendricks County on the Hysong Drain and that he would call Al Huntsman and ask him to release the rights to it and allow us to take care of it. Sam Kessler said, yes, that, in fact, we have more acres involved than they do. Harvey continued that they had worked with the Soil

Harvey continued that they had worked with the Soil Conservation Service at the airport on the <u>James Gilliland</u> <u>Drain</u>. North of the runway, farmers have driven along this and packed the dirt down. There is water all around. If we could get in and expose the tile, S.C.S. could run a 6 inch tile parallel to ours, but it is too wet at the present time.

At this time, Tom Dawson and Attorney, Monty Harris, representing Montgomery Savings Association, came for a hearing on the <u>Shelley Square Drain</u>. Mr. Harris stated that Montgomery Savings has the option to buy land there for the purpose of erecting condominiums, but this would necessitate changes in the right-of-way for Shelley Drain. At this time statutes state a 75 foot easement on each side of the center tile. Mr. Harris asked the approval of the board to reduce the easement to 25 feet on each side and to build within 10 feet of the tile. 127

Attorney Don Schmidt stated that the board had already agreed on a 25 foot easement and that Harvey had sent them a letter stating such, but that they would not agree to building within 10 feet of the tile. He further recommended that the city be asked to take this as a municipal responsibility, as they have spent a lot of money on it recently. The county would not be involved that way and county statutes wouldn't apply. Mr. Harris said they would discuss this.

Harvey said that east and south where it runs in back of the First Baptist Church it is heavily wooded and they would be unable to do it, but it would be easier for the city to do it. Mr. Harris asked if it was really necessary to have 50 feet of clear space? Don Schmidt replied that yes it is in order to get large equipment in to work on it. Sam Kessler said otherwise the building might be too close.

The board approved the 25 foot right-of-way as is, and will await to see what the city of Crawfordsville does. Marion Kirtley adjourned the meeting at 2:00 p.m.

Chairman, Dr. Kirtley, called the meeting to order.

The Surveyor reported the following items:

Not much tile repair work is being done at this time, as crops are in.

Lough-Miller Drain: a tile hole (yet to be repaired).

Charles McFarland Drain: maintenance account has zero balance.

Richard Virts Drain: maintenance account has zero balance.

The McFarland and Virts Drains are scheduled for hearings to increase maintenance assessments.

William Davis Drain: repairs to be done in the fall.

Lye Creek Drain: there is a dam caused from debris and the travel path is showing a lot of brush growth. (South of 1000 North).

James Gilliland Drain: Problems at the runway. Water is standing in the waterway. The tile was checked and nothing is wrong there.The S.C.S. Office would like to place a 6 inch tile next to the existing tile.

A.F. Ward Drain: there is 850 feet of open ditch to be cleaned out next year.

<u>George Nichols Drain</u>: in Bible's Addition the problem is with the private tile lines. The upper end needs willows cleared out.

Landowner, Mr. Hart, is having problems with standing water, due to the fact that the surrounding neighbors have built up their lawns and Mr. Hart has not, thereby, his property is the low spot. James Hose Drain: Harvey proposed replacing 100 feet of (bell tile) with perforated plastic tile.

Joseph Ludlow Drain: Contractors, Cain Brothers, will be working this fall.

Wm. McClamroch Drain: needs to be petitioned.

John Baker Drain: located near Smartsburg, a petition is being circulated now.

Levi Hawkins Drain: located near Alamo, a petition is needed.

<u>W.A. Henthorn Drain</u>: located southeast of Waynetown, a petition is needed.

<u>Phillip Dewey Drain</u>: Farm Manager, Jim Clark, is asking landowners in this watershed if they want to petition for added reconstruction and increased acres in the watershed.

July 24, 1989 -conti-

<u>Wm. Epperson Drain</u>: reconstruction is completed but there are some minor problems at the lower end where the ditch ends. <u>Albert Hysong Drain</u>: Hendricks County was to meet with Commissioners to see if they would consider waiving their rights to representation on this joint board with Montgomery County. (Mr. Kessler stated he went to Hendricks County Surveyors Office

and talked to Al Huntsman).

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Member, Sam Kessler, requested the Secretary to make the length and drainage acre percent changes on the waiver form and forward said form on to the Hendricks County Drainage Board.

Mr. Kessler felt that the Hysong Drain should not be an open drain, ordinarily there is no surface water and if there is it is only after a large rain. An open drain requires a lot of maintenance as in brush control, silting and erosion of banks.

For the period from August 28th to December 4th, 25 drains are being scheduled for hearings before the Board to revise the maintenance assessments. The first hearing is set for August 28th on the following three drains, William Davis, Charles McFarland and Fred & Bessie Brown.

E.B. Foster is working on the Nancy Hollingsworth and Robert Rutan Drains.

In 1988, 3 ditch sprayers were used.

- (a) E.B. Foster sprayed some of the smaller jobs as he does not have the equipment for large jobs.
- (b) Blackhorse Company used "Garlon 4" chemical.
- (c) Chemitrol Company used "Rodeo" spray. "Garlon" worked best on ditch banks and "Rodeo" worked best in ditch bottoms. The overall results were an 85% kill. A lot of under brush was not killed by any of the three sprayers. Harvey felt that the weather pattern had some play on the results of the ditch spraying.

Mr. Kessler stated for best results the brush should be cleared first then use ditch spraying, or spray every year.

Dalton Gang would accept the job with payments over a 5 year span.

Lye Creek: Brush is out of control, I would like to continue to spray this drain, I will continue with 10 or 12 drains either this fall or the following March. Chemitrol Company sprayed some drains in Tippecanoe County in March and the results were very favorable.

Last year 24 drains were sprayed using 5,000 gallons with 1.5% chemicals. This year I anticipate going 8,000 gallons @ \$2.00/gallon applied for a total cost of \$16,000.00.

July 24, 1989 -conti-

Mr. Kessler $ask_{\ell \delta}$ if the Timothy Lane Drain had been sprayed since reconstruction Answer was yes, aproximately 1 mile of the upper end. Also, part of the Moses Maxwell Drain has been sprayed. <u>Joseph Hall Drain</u>: The Surveyor reported brush and willows are starting up, but with the very steep banks, he was not sure if he wanted to spray the banks. Mr. Kessler stated that the willows should be removed. Due to the cost, any work will have to be planned for a later time.

<u>William Yelton Drain</u>: Mr. Kessler stated he had some ditch work done on this area and it looked great. He ask Harvey to stop and take a look. Harvey stated he was planning to be in that area tomorrow, digging for section stones on State Road 234 and he would make a point to stop then. Harvey reported that he was going to bill R.E.M.C. for placing poles in the ditch. Mr. Kessler stated he would like to see this drain placed on assessment.

Mr. Kessler reported that Hendricks County is placing a 2% drainage assessment on all property owners.

The Board signed the minutes of April, May and June meetings. There was one correction to be made by the Secretary in the minutes of the meeting held May 30th, 1989.

There being no further business, Chairman, Dr. Kirtley, recessed the meeting. Time 2:25 P.M.

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Harvey reported that this drain is in very poor condition, the tile holes are extremely large. Tile is 15 -18 inch and will be expensive to replace. There is approximately 600 to 700 feet near the outlet to be replaced. Sam Kessler recommended starting at the upper end and using the remaining balance of \$710.61 to get the work started.

Richard Klepfer wants to petition for reconstruction. The Board agreed to provide the General Drain Improvement Fund with the necessary funds if the reconstruction is accepted by the landowners.

One letter of remonstrance was received from (Richard & Gladys Brown). This letter was not received in time to be valid. Letter is postmarked, October 20, 1989. Deadline of 5 days prior to the hearing date would be October 18, 1989.

Harvey ask if this Board is responsible to have beaver's trapped and removed. The Board stated that due to the damage beavers can do in a very short time, yes. By all means we should pay to have them removed. But it was also the boards recommendation that if the ditch banks were kept cleaned the beavers would not be a problem. Beaver's have built a dam on the Will N. Brown Ditch.

Property owners in Clearview Addition have lawns that are like sponges, even in dry weather. The Board recommended landowners with standing water should put in private tile.

The Surveyor noted that this drain appeared to have been working until a small woods located west of Clearview was removed. The City (Crawfordsville) is putting in a sewer on the North side of Clearview; when tiles from the sub-division were cut they were not re-connected. The city is giving the owners the option of tying on to the city sewer line.

During construction of Calsonic International, Inc. on the west side of the (new) road a tile was cut and not reconnected. If this tile is found to be a part of this legal drain the contractor will need to replace damaged tile and connect to the legal drain. This area is very flat. Attorney, Dick Tulley, suggested installing two surface inlet pipes. One where the tile was cut and another in the area of the west property line of Calsonic. Mr. Tulley further stated that he had a map of the legal drain (F. Flether) and ask that the Surveyor review this map.

Sam Kessler moved and Bob Thayer seconded a motion to have the tile (on Calsonic International, Inc.) repaired, and install a surface inlet pipe, and to accept the revised maintenance assessment of \$1,156.00 per year. Motion carried.
